This Annual Report provides you with a basic overview and accountability of how your generosity of time, talent and treasure is a living witness of Our Mission. Please keep in mind that numbers tell only part of our story. Our faith cannot be quantified and the call to discipleship and ministry lies in the hearts of God's holy people. - that we need to achieve a substantial increase in our Sunday giving as well as an increase in our capital campaign pledges.

Many people use this year-end period to reexamine their giving, so I hope you can remember all the ways our many parish ministries benefit all of us, from the very young to the very old.

Please know that your parish is grateful for all you do!

A Message From Our Parish Finance Council

We are pleased to send you the operating financial statement of our parish for the period July 1, 2017 to June 30, 2018, as well as a status report on our Capital Campaign, *From Generation To Generation*. We encourage you to read this closely, but here are some of the highlights as we see them:

We have much of which to be proud:

- Our parish continues to provide an ever-increasing number of services and ministries to our parishioners. This is the future of a healthy parish, and it requires an increasing number of lay volunteers and associated expenses. We have been in the fortunate position of having the resources, especially the many dedicated people who devote their time and energies to their neighbors, fellow parishioners and to others outside our parish.
- Our parish operating expenses continue to be under strict control, both church and school, with staffing being maintained at the right levels and materials, supplies and utilities being purchased at the right cost and at the right times.
- Our Capital Campaign began in 2016 and succeeded in reaching its \$5,000,000 goal in pledges to remodel and reconfigure space in the Benedict Center and in the Lemont and Keene Avenue buildings. This massive project will enable us to far more efficiently use the space within our buildings for the benefit of all members of our parish, from the very young to the very old.
- Our school remains very strong, with 652 students during the 2017/18 school year. Parents provided 96% of the direct operating costs of the school, which clearly demonstrates their commitment to a quality Catholic education for their children.

But we have big challenges:

- On the other hand, maintenance and repairs will continue to grow as our buildings age, despite closely attentive and regularly scheduled inspections. Just as our own homes require increased maintenance costs over time, so too will our beautiful and valued parish properties.
- Just as important is **the matter of our Basilica ceiling**, which is a capital expense not reflected in the operating statement. We have mentioned a number of times the unfortunate and sudden need to replace our entire ceiling last year.
- In addition to the Basilica ceiling is the **current situation in the Basilica bell tower**, where recent inspections indicated an immediate need to repair stone work and other structural elements to arrest water infiltration and damage to the interior of the Basilica.
- Due to the prudent foresight of those who came before us we were in the fortunate position of being able to fund the over \$1.8 million cost of the ceiling project (including the full replacement of the ceiling, the removal and reinstallation of the organ, and other repair expenses) and the estimated \$1.3 million cost of the bell tower project from our savings. However, we have borrowed so deeply from our savings that prudence and fairness demand that our savings must be replenished in the coming years.
- In the course of our capital campaign work in the Benedict Center we encountered a number of unforeseen construction problems, including an expanded scope of the asbestos removal and a number of construction adjustments inherent in working in an older building. Those of us who have managed home remodeling projects are familiar with project adjustments. In our parish buildings those are far more costly, since we have to construct and maintain our buildings for constant use by thousands of people both today and for generations to come.

So, what must we do:

We are faced with two immediate financial needs:

• First, we need to acknowledge that our Sunday collections have been level over the last few years. Some parishes might consider that a positive. We do not. Standing still is not an option. Our future depends on doing more for ourselves and that will require more financial resources.

To the contrary, we need to increase our regular Sunday collections by a minimum of at least 20% annually. That will allow us to begin to run annual operating surpluses and to repay our own savings for the funds borrowed to pay for the Basilica ceiling and bell tower projects.

• Second, we need to increase our Capital Campaign pledge goal from \$5,000,000 to \$6,000,000. The good news is that we have already raised about \$200,000 toward that new goal, so we have \$800,000 to go.

What do we ask:

We know that we have many faithful supporters, who provide for their church on a regular basis. We are extraordinarily grateful for their efforts. Without them we would not be able to be where we are today.

- We have not made a vigorous appeal for a Sunday collection increase for several years, but now we must. At this time, we ask that you **increase your Sunday offering ideally by a minimum of 20%**, and hopefully more if you can afford it. We know that many of our parishioners stretch themselves to support our parish, which is why our average Sunday envelope contains about \$35 per week. Others certainly have the ability to support our parish beyond that average.
- We also ask those whose circumstances permit to increase their capital campaign pledges.
- We ask those who have not yet pledged or are new to our parish and are benefitting from the generosity of the past to make a pledge.

We know that our fellow parishioners always do the right thing when they are given the facts, and that is why we confidently lay before you the situation we now face.

FINANCIAL REPORT - QUEEN OF ALL SAINTS PARISH - FOR LAST TWO FISCAL YEARS ENDING JUNE 30

- Parish revenues were up 2.0% for FY 17/18. Sunday and Holy Day collections were up 1.0%, while Christmas was down 3.6% and Easter was down 1.5%, but UPP (excluding the Lemont Building window pledges of \$52,000) was up 6.1%. The relatively small decreases in Holy Day collections are attributed to the far greater amount pledged to our capital campaign during the preceding fiscal year. We hope this will adjust positively during the 18/19 fiscal year.
- Parish expenses in general remained under control, while noting a significant increase in repairs and maintenance. Salaries and benefits were up due to normal salary adjustments as well as a continued increase in health insurance costs.
- The Basilica ceiling project and bell tower project represent highly unexpected expenditures, discussed elsewhere in this report. Payments for these projects were made from parish savings, which must be replenished in future years. Increased repairs and maintenance are expected with any aging physical plant, but we believe our planned schedule for those items is prudent and will keep our buildings safe and attractive for the long run on a cost effective basis.

Parish revenues and expenses do not include the Third Sunday Collections for Sharing Parishes and other second collections, which are directly paid out as intended by the donors. The parish also received \$92,217 from the Annual Catholic Appeal, representing the excess contributed by parishioners over the parish's target collection goal as set by the Archdiocese, as adjusted for the fact that we conducted a capital campaign during this fiscal year.

*Additional funds were collected during FY 17/18 at the May 2018 UPP in pledges for the Lemont Building window replacement project, which was completed in the summer. To avoid distortions in financial reporting, the amount collected at the May 2018 UPP is not included in the FY 17/18 revenue and the corresponding expenditures will not be included in FY 18/19 expenses. ** The increase in expenses were due to the change in priest personnel and relocation of various offices to accommodate the Campaign construction.

FINANCIAL REPORT-QUEEN OF ALL SAINTS SCHOOL-FOR LAST TWO FISCAL YEARS ENDING JUNE 30

- School enrollment continued to be strong, with 652 students enrolled for the year, pre-school through eighth grade. Tuition revenue rose 2.1%, while total tuition/subsidy/endowment was down 1.1% and total expenses was down 1.4%. Pre-school enrollment for the FY18/19 year was sharply reduced due to the capital campaign construction in the Benedict Center, along with the corresponding tuition and expenses. It is expected that this situation will be corrected in FY19/20 when the new pre-school facilities are opened.
- Tuition and fees covered 96% of direct school expenses, which shows the vitality of the school and the commitment of the parents. With the support of both parents and parish our school was able to spend \$99,702 on technological infrastructure, devices, applications and training, all to provide the best possible educational experience for our children.
- As is the case with parish expenses, repairs and maintenance continue to rise. We will continue to keep our school plant safe and suitable for an optimal learning experience.

*The Queen of All Saints School Endowment was established in 1991 to provide an additional source of revenue for our parish school, supplementing tuition paid by parents and a direct subsidy from parish operations, if necessary. During FY 17/18 the school received \$155,270 from the endowment and \$0 from parish operations.

**Additionally, certain expenses directly paid from the parish budget indirectly benefit the school, such as common area maintenance and improvements. An allocation of these school-related expenses is estimated at \$340,000 for FY 17/18.


The Basilica Ceiling and Bell Tower, and Our Sunday Collections

We have talked a lot about our ceiling project and our bell tower projects these past two years—that sudden circumstances forced us to act promptly and prudently to replace the entire ceiling of the Basilica, which dated back to the original construction of the church building, which then uncovered the need for significant repairs to our bell tower. We have also talked about how we were in the fortunate position to be able to fund the entire upfront cost of these projects from our savings, due to the foresight and generosity of those who came before us.

The ceiling project cost \$1.8 million (including the full replacement of the ceiling, the removal and reinstallation of the organ, and other repair expenses) and the bell tower project is estimated to cost \$1.3 million. That's at least how much we need to replenish our savings.

The only way we can do that is to significantly increase our Sunday collections for the foreseeable future.

Our Sunday collections have been stable for a number of years. That's good, but not good enough for a parish like ours.



WHAT WE CAN DO TODAY?

Please take the time to consider the role our parish plays in our lives.

Consider the list of ministries our parish now supports. Ask yourself how many of those ministries have touched your own life.

Consider how important it is to have a broad array of ministries and activities that hold together our parish family.

Consider the sacrifices of those who came before us to build the magnificent Basilica in which we worship.

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Our Capital Campaign Project What is it? Why we are doing it? Who is it for? How can you do your part?

Why are the renovations necessary?

Our Benedict Center was constructed in 1952 as the Queen of All Saints Convent for the Benedictine Sisters who served our community until 1993. Since that time, much of the building became underutilized, increasingly more costly to maintain and inaccessible to those with limited mobility. This remarkable structure was integral to our architectural beauty and parish history, but had fallen into disrepair and underuse. **Meanwhile, we have real needs on our campus for more and better classroom space and accessible meeting rooms.** Not only does renovating the Benedict Center go a long way toward meeting these needs, stewarding our historic structures is a responsibility for the entire Church community.

Why are we also renovating spaces in the Lemont and Keene Buildings?

The Benedict Center renovation will create space by renovating former living quarters for small meetings and, importantly, allowing us to move school functions – such as the pre-Kindergarten classes and the SPRED ministry – to the Benedict Center from the Lemont and Keene buildings. In turn, the plan then opens up larger spaces for classrooms and meetings inside Lemont and Keene. Renovating the Benedict Center alone would not solve our space issues, because the building footprint is simply too small. Additionally, this plan consolidates the pre-K students in one building and ensures the new classrooms remain in the main school buildings.

What will it cost?

Our initial fundraising goal was for \$5,000,000 in pledges, and was based on early and often incomplete drawings from the original construction of the Benedict Center building. Thanks to the tremendous generosity of our parishioners we were able to meet that goal! However, after actual construction began we were faced with better estimates of our ultimate construction costs, including an expanded scope of the asbestos removal and a number of construction adjustments inherent in working in an older building.

Our revised fundraising goal is now \$6,000,000, an increase of \$1,000,000. The good news is that we are already \$200,000 of the way toward meeting that new goal!

Please consider how you can help this vital investment in our parish. If you have already pledged, perhaps your current circumstances will permit an increase in that pledge. 

"And this is my prayer: that your love may increase ever more and more in knowledge and every kind of perception, to discern what is of value..." PHILIPPIANS 1:9-10

Glittery holiday ads can blind us to our stewardship values and distort our needs and wants. It is important that during this season of endless buying we remember that each of us also has the need to give back to God and to those that are in need.

Stewardship—Understanding our Parish Finances

We rely on three main sources of funds:

Sundays, Holidays, UPP—This is our regular revenue and is by far the largest source of funds to pay for our parish operations. In a sense, this is what "keeps the lights on" by paying for our staff, our routine repairs and maintenance, and the other day to day costs of running the parish. **Our Christmas collection is our parish's largest holiday collection and is critical in reaching our annual financial goals.**

Long-Term Savings—We are blessed with savings resulting from the generosity of the past, including parish and school endowments. The earnings from these accounts is used to supplement our regular revenue to balance the budget and, on occasion, to pay for extraordinary repairs. We have recently drawn upon those savings deeply to pay for the unanticipated basilica ceiling project and the bell tower project, and now need to take steps to replenish those savings. We will need a significant increase in our Sunday collections to pay ourselves back and restore our savings to a prudent level.

Capital Campaign—Our capital campaign drive will be used to make our older parish buildings more suitable for today's and tomorrow's needs, including making better use of space for school needs and for the needs of our increasing numbers of lay ministries. Our new construction projections require us to raise our target from \$5,000,000 to \$6,000,000. We have already raised \$200,000 of that new target. Please consider how you can help us reach our new goal.

We believe that a well-informed parish membership deserves an explanation of parish finances. Please be as generous as you can in your Christmas and other year-end giving to our parish.

The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year, at 1:30pm. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A Baptismal Preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must also be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.
