FROM FATHER SIMON



Happy St. Patrick's Day and Happy St. Joseph's Day. Whether you celebrate it by being part of a parade and watch the Chicago River dyed green or just attend Mass, whether you celebrate it making sure you have a meal that includes cornedbeef, cabbage and Irish soda bread or share the food of St. Joseph's table, these days are special.

For me it is about celebrating my dad whose birthday is March 20 and his name is Patrick Joseph. He is named in honor of these two saints whose feast-day precedes his birthday. For most of us it is celebrating our culture and our roots. Immigrants in the 1800's risked everything to cross the Atlantic Ocean and resettle for a better life in a still very young United States. Even after the hazardous journey, they were scorned as outsiders and some labeled as thugs. Through all of this, they persevered. Each generation of immigrants improved their circumstances and carved out a chapter of the American story. This holiday is the celebration of succeeding in a new life as an American. So as you raise that green beer or a glass of red wine, toast the immigrants that came before you to make the United States an exceptional country.

Even to this day there are thousands of people who are seeking to come to this country for a better life for themselves and their families. One such family has made its way to Chicago and is being hosted by a family in our parish as they work through the asylum process. I am grateful to the host family that has opened its home and their hearts to this immigrant family of three, parents and a teenager, helping them live with the dignity they deserve and supporting them in realizing the American dream.

This week our Lenten calendar recommends that we practice the discipline of almsgiving and embrace the virtue of compassion. When three more members are added to your family there are unexpected accommodations and sacrifices that are called for in addition to the financial burden. So, if you are considering giving something to someone in need – this immigrant family is in need of CTA passes, food and help to pay for their phone service. Some of the medical professionals in the parish have helped out with their immediate medical needs *pro bono* and to them I am grateful. If you feel called to help them, you could bring grocery store cards, bus passes or cash and drop them off at the rectory marked 'Help the Stranger'.

I want to assure you that I appreciate all your help and that no parish funds are used to assist this family. The assistance this family is receiving comes from the generosity of the host family and this community. If you cannot help, I ask you to be compassionate to the stranger amongst us. This was the mandate given to our ancestors in faith – to always welcome the widow, the orphan and the stranger (Deut. 10:18-19), and while you are at the top, never forget what it is like to be at the bottom.

Queen of All Saints Parish Lenten Reflection Responding to the Call of Discipleship

~ Week of March 17, 2019 ~

Theme: Forgive

Scripture: Mark 11:25

Whenever you stand praying, forgive, if you have anything against anyone, so that your Father who is in heaven will also forgive you your transgressions.

Reflection: The need to be forgiven and the need to forgive.

Jesus died on the cross for all people for all time. His words about the power of prayer and the importance of not holding grudges emphasize that if you have confessed your own sins and weaknesses and have asked him to forgive you, then you must forgive others as well.

Everyone of us has been hurt, are hurting now, or are going to be hurt by somebody. To risk love is to risk hurt. It is simply unavoidable but we can deal with hurt. No pain is too deep or widespread to lie beyond God's forgiveness. However, if we choose not to forgive, that can be a devastatingly bad choice. It not only harms the relationship, it also wounds the one who refuses to forgive. A bitter heart seldom realizes that what you have is more important than what you don't have.

Practice: Almsgiving

Virtue: Compassion

Examples:

- Assume that people who may have hurt you did so because they have pain of their own.
- Go out of your way to be positive with someone with whom you are having a difficult time.
- Offer positive words of encouragement to someone having a difficult time.
- Work at being less critical of others.
- Pray for the courage to forgive.
- Lend a sympathetic ear to someone struggling with his or her career or marriage.
- Share your insights, skills and knowledge with others. Tutor a beginner.
- Help a widow or widower with yard work or errands.
- Take the time to visit, call or send a card to someone who is sick or homebound.
- Go through your closet and donate gently used clothes.
- Volunteer or support the St. Cornelius Food Pantry.





San Pedro Calungsod Novena

All are invited to participate in the Filipino-American Community Association's annual Lenten Novena to St. Pedro Calungsod. St. Calungsod was a young Roman Catholic Filipino, a migrant, sacristan and missionary catechist, who along with the Spanish Jesuit missionary, Diego Luis de San Vitores, suffered religious



persecution and martyrdom in Guam for their missionary work in 1672. While in Guam, Calungsod preached Christianity to the Chamorro people through catechism, while baptizing infants, children and adults at the risk and expense of being persecuted and eventually murdered. Through Calungsod and San Vitores' missionary efforts, many native Chamorros converted to Roman Catholicism. Calungsod was formally beatified in March 2000 by St. John Paul II and was officially canonized by Pope Benedict XVI in October 2012.

The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year, at 1:30pm. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A Baptismal Preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must also be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick


