# FROM FATHER SIMON



We are almost halfway through Lent and some of us might be saying to ourselves 'Halfway! I can do this' or some might find ourselves thinking 'Halfway! Perhaps I could cheat a bit' or some of us may find ourselves at the starting point 'I really need to do the things I promised I would do this Lent'. Wherever we find ourselves at this point in Lent, we have to remember that God meets us wherever we are on the journey.

The story of Moses' encounter with God from the burning bush, that we hear this week, reminds us that even though we are not where we should be in the journey of discipleship, God is willing to adapt and accommodate us. Moses fled the fury of Pharaoh of Egypt and settled down to what was considered 'normal' life for an adult male of his time. He was not where he should have been. God rescues and invites him to live up to his calling. We can use this time in Lent to strengthen our resolve to be attuned to the call of the Holy One.

Lent is also a *time of grace* to deepen our faith in the Lord, to recommit ourselves to seeing how central faith truly is to our lives and to ensure that we are living our life with coherence, that is, we must assure that there is great consistency between the faith that we proclaim and in which we believe, and how we are conducting our everyday life.

Our faith and what we believe are constantly challenged by our culture and public policies. Today's challenge is with the two bills introduced in the Illinois House and Senate *(please read the Cardinal's letter in this bulletin on page 5)*. We must examine how we are participating in the most crucial struggle of our time, the defense of all human persons from conception to natural end.

All of us are called to respond to this reckless disregard for human life. The ways in which we participate will be different. Some of us who have heavy family responsibilities, or are elderly, or are called to the contemplative life will participate with our prayers. Others can, in addition to prayer, participate by calling our State Representative and Senator and impress upon them the need to defeat these bills.

May the God who heard the cry of his people, felt their pain and rescued them do the same for us, in our need!

#### Queen of All Saints Parish Lenten Reflection Responding to the Call of Discipleship

#### ~ Week of March 24th, 2019 ~

**Theme**: *Take up your cross and follow me* 

**Scripture**: Luke 11:2-4, *"Then he said to all, 'If anyone wishes to come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow Me."* 

**Reflection**: Many people interpret a cross as a burden you carry in your life. Jesus said "take up your cross and follow Me." It is a call to absolute surrender. Following Jesus is easy when life runs smoothly. If there comes a point in your life when you are faced with a choice between Jesus and the comforts of this life, which will you choose? Your commitment to Jesus means taking up your cross daily, giving up your hopes, dreams, possessions, for the cause of Christ. The reward is worth the price.

What can you do to deny yourself and take up your cross to follow Jesus? Jesus asks that we take up our cross - not take up his cross. The cross symbolizes pain and suffering. What are you willing to do to say "no" to yourself and be willing to suffer just like Jesus suffered? What are you doing to deny yourself various pleasures in this world? This is how we come to Jesus. You deny yourself and lean on Jesus, rather than yourself.

God's grace gives us the courage to carry our cross.

#### **Practice**: Fasting

#### Virtue: Courage

#### Examples:

- Be a good neighbor or friend. Pay attention to what others need, especially the crosses they carry, and try to help.
- Have the courage to stand up for your faith and what you believe.
- Let go it's often easier to hold onto something that causes us pain, than to let it go. By letting go of that emotion, you take back control of your life.
- Pray and ask Jesus for help.
- Focus on solutions, rather than the problem.
- Practice being more patient.
- Scarcity can lead people to focus on enjoying an experience more deeply, which increases happiness.
- Say that you love someone or that you forgive someone if they wronged you. Bottling up emotions only leads to an outburst, usually when it's unfounded.
- Defy the status quo. Just because something has always been done a certain way, doesn't mean that it is necessarily the best way. Try something new, put yourself out there.
- If a family member or friend is being bullied, be there to support them and be helpful. Do your part to not participate in a bullying situation.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

With this letter I write to you about a development that should disturb us greatly, both as citizens and as disciples of Jesus, the Lord of life.

Recently, two bills have been introduced in the Illinois House and Senate. The first, House Bill 2495 and Senate Bill 1942, both identical pieces of legislation, seeks to strip unborn persons of any protection – or even consideration – under the law and declare abortion to be a "fundamental right" and matter of health care. The end result is that an abortion could be obtained at any stage of pregnancy, including late term, for any reason and without any regulation. The law would no longer guarantee any modicum of humanity or compassion for any unborn person in Illinois, even if they are partially born. This legislation also repeals the Abortion Performance Refusal Act, which protects doctors, nurses and hospitals who refuse to permit, recommend, perform or assist in abortion. In so doing, rights of conscience, especially religious objections, will be lost.

The second piece of legislation House Bill 2467 and its identical Senate Bill 1594, repeals the Illinois Parental Notice of Abortion Act. This law, upheld unanimously by the Illinois Supreme Court just six years ago, has the common-sense purpose of ensuring that parents would be part of the life-altering decision of their minor child in the case she seeks an abortion. This effective law has reduced abortions performed on minors by fifty-seven percent.

As citizens of a state and people of faith who care about the common good, I urge you to join me and my brother bishops in an effort to defeat this radical departure from current law and practice in our state. Please reach out your State Representative and Senator to urge defeat of these bills. # San Pedro Calungsod Novena

Mother's Chapel

All are invited to participate in the Filipino-American Community Association's annual Lenten Novena to Saint Pedro Calungsod, a young Filipino, migrant, sacristan and missionary catechist, who suffered religious persecution and martyrdom in Guam for his missionary work in 1672. In Guam, Calungsod preached Christianity to the Chamorro people, baptizing infants, children and adults, at the risk of being persecuted and eventually murdered. Through Calungsod missionary efforts, many native Chamorros converted to Roman Catholicism. Calungsod was formally beatified in March 2000 by St. John Paul II and was officially canonized by Pope Benedict XVI in October 2012.



# Stewardship - Be a Good Steward of the Lenten Season

The Lenten season prepares us for the celebration of Easter. It is a time for Christians to embrace **prayer**, **fasting, and almsgiving** in a more concerted way. For some it is a time of healing, an opportunity to repair the spiritual brokenness. For others it is simply a good time to cultivate their spiritual lives in a more disciplined manner. **The goal of Lenten practices is to prepare ourselves to enter into the paschal mystery of Holy Week with a more humble spirit and determination to follow Jesus Christ**. This ancient triad of prayer, fasting and almsgiving offers wonderful spiritual benefits. Being a good steward of these gifts by planning ahead and following through is essential to having a fruitful Lenten experience. This week, let's consider prayer.

**Prayer**: What greater gift could we give our selves during Lent than the gift of prayer? The fruits of developing a disciplined time of prayer are bountiful. Make plans for a prayer time each day. Do not wait until you "find time" **but make a time of prayer your priority**. This will involve sacrifice on your part perhaps giving up some television viewing time, using part of your lunch hour, or getting up in the morning earlier than usual. Along the way, spend some time in extra prayer with the community - a weekday Mass, Stations of the Cross. **Whatever you decide, resolve to spend more time with the Lord.**

#### **The Sacrament of Baptism**

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year, at 1:30pm. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A Baptismal Preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must also be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

#### **The Sacrament of Matrimony**

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

#### Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.
