# LENT 2019

## Queen of All Saints Parish Lenten Reflection Responding to the Call of Discipleship

~ Week of April 7th, 2019 ~

**Theme:** *What you did for the least of these...*

**Scripture:** Matthew 25:40, “*And the king will say to them in reply, ‘Amen, I say to you whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me.’*”

**Reflection:** Who is my brother? What is solidarity?

Saint John Paul II defined solidarity in one of his encyclicals on social justice: It “is not a feeling of vague compassion or shallow distress at the misfortunes of so many people, both near and far. On the contrary, **it is a firm and persevering determination to commit oneself to the common good**, that is to say, to the good of all and of each individual because we are all really responsible for all.”

Our Lord said that he came to this earth not to *be* served but *to* serve. He is the perfect king, a king who loves his subjects so deeply and truly that *he* serves *them*. We, who are baptized into his kingship, exercise it when we love as he loved, when we serve as he served. Our Lord returned to Heaven where now *he* is served, both in our worship and in our service to one another. Christ tells us plainly that when we serve one another, especially the suffering, the poor, and the neglected, we are serving him.

These works of love call us to solidarity, they challenge us to recognize Christ in one another, where we might least expect to find him. In its final document, *Gaudium et Spes*, the Second Vatican Council boldly proclaimed that, because God took on human flesh in the Incarnation, Jesus Christ united himself in some way to every single human being, *just because they’re human!* (cf. GS 22) In our Lord’s solidarity with our human nature, we find the source of all human solidarity.

**Practice:** Almsgiving

**Virtue:** Generosity

**Examples:**

- Prepare a shoebox for the St. Vincent de Paul collection.
- Donate items in good condition to the St. Vincent de Paul clothing box, Salvation Army, Goodwill or other charitable organization to provide jobs and resources to those in need.
- Spiritually adopt an unborn child by praying that that child’s life be spared abortion and he/she be allowed to continue to live. See [www.spiritualadoption.com](http://www.spiritualadoption.com) for more info.
- Pay a visit, phone or send a kind note to an elderly or home-bound person to let them know they are not forgotten.
- Plan coffee or lunch with someone who might be lonely or going through a difficult time.
- Send a note or care package to someone in the military to show you’re thinking of them. If you have a military address, Amazon will deliver directly to the serviceman or servicewoman.

## Stewardship - Be a Good Steward of the Lenten Season

The Lenten season prepares us for the celebration of Easter. It is a time for Christians to embrace **prayer, fasting, and almsgiving** in a more concerted way. For some it is a time of healing, an opportunity to repair the spiritual brokenness. For others it is simply a good time to cultivate their spiritual lives in a more disciplined manner. **The goal of Lenten practices is to prepare ourselves to enter into the paschal mystery of Holy Week with a more humble spirit and determination to follow Jesus Christ.** This ancient triad of prayer, fasting and almsgiving offers wonderful spiritual benefits. Being a good steward of these gifts by planning ahead and following through is essential to having a fruitful Lenten experience. This week, let's consider almsgiving

**Almsgiving:** This spiritual discipline heightens our sense of generosity. Just as an increase in **prayer and fasting** leads us to be more grateful for the gifts we've received, and promotes a greater awareness of others, **almsgiving helps us to reach out to others in gratitude.** Just as we don't "squeeze in" time to pray during Lent, we also don't scrutinize our checkbook when being generous with others. Make a plan and let a meaningful sense of sacrifice be your guide.

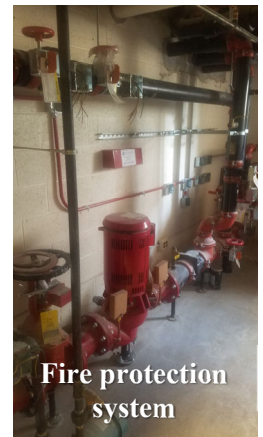
*"For his sake I have accepted the loss of all things and I consider them so much rubbish, that I may gain Christ..."*

## The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year, at 1:30pm. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A Baptismal Preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must also be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

## The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

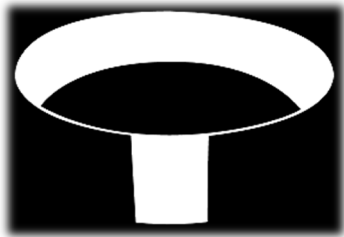
## Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick
