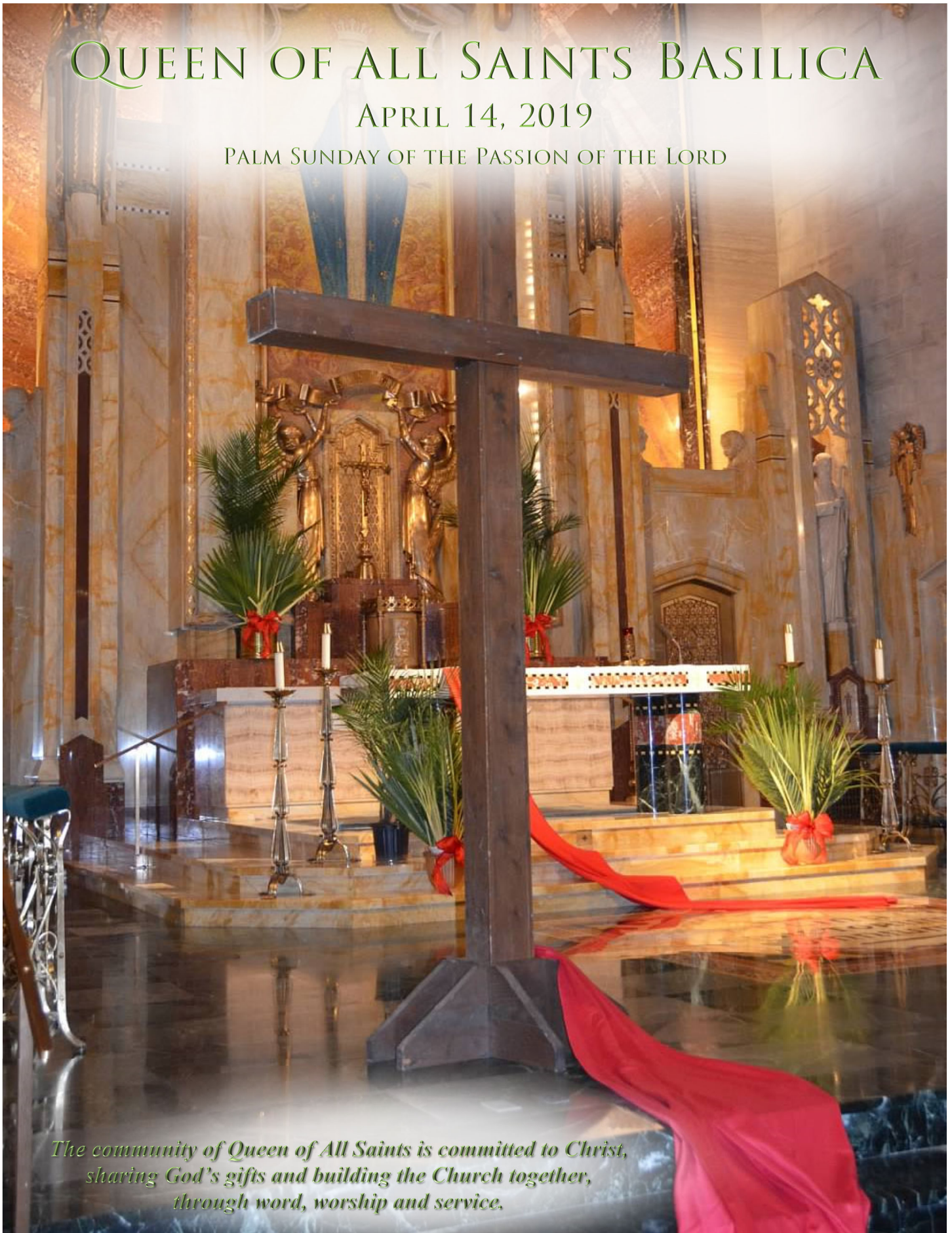

PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD

FROM FATHER SIMON



Today we enter the most sacred week in the Church's liturgical calendar. This week we celebrate the mystery of a divinely extravagant love that lies at the heart of our faith, Jesus' death and resurrection. We begin today with the liturgy of Palm Sunday, when we gather together and reenact the scene of his entry into Jerusalem, riding on a donkey, to the cheers of the crowd.

Today, we, the people, will shout "hosanna" in the liturgy of the palms, and "crucify him" in the reading of the passion. What is interesting in this Palm Sunday liturgy, as we listen to the story of Jesus' last hours, is that we, the congregation, operate in the role of *observers* of Jesus' actions, and are indeed somewhat torn as the mood of the liturgy shifts from joyful hosannas to a condemning 'crucify him'.

Our stance will change radically as we progress through the liturgies that will take place later in Holy Week. On Holy Thursday, our attention will focus on his last meal with the disciples, immediately prior to his betrayal and arrest. We will hear the story of Jesus washing the feet of the disciples. Subtly but surely, we will be invited to move from being mere *observers* to *identifying* with Jesus and to *imitating* him. As Jesus explains: "I have washed your feet so you also ought to wash one another's feet. I have set before you an example, that you should do as I have done to you." Jesus' message is clear. Our sharing in the Eucharist – in the Holy Thursday liturgy and in every celebration of the Eucharist – is a participation in this ministry of service to each other and to the world.

When we then come to Good Friday and we listen again to the account of his passion and death, we will come not as mere *observers*, somewhat detached from the events before us, but as *responders* to the call, to *follow* his way and *imitate* his compassion, hospitality, love and concern for others, especially for the poor and marginalized.

Holy Week will culminate in the Easter Vigil Eucharist, when we will celebrate Jesus' paschal mystery of new life through suffering and death, and our entry into this great mystery of life and love. We are no longer mere *observers*, nor even just *imitators*. We are now *deeply immersed* in Jesus' paschal mystery. So, we are incorporated into the life and love of God, the author of this great story of love. Come and be part of the Triduum liturgies here at the basilica.

On a mundane note, and not wanting to distract your participation in the solemn days of the Triduum, I want to draw your attention to the invitation you received to our one and only fundraiser in the parish, the UPP. I encourage and ask for your continued support of this program by sending in your RSVP, buying raffle tickets, donating items to our auction or being a sponsor. You will find information in the bulletin and on our website. I thank you for your support in the past, and gratefully anticipate your continued support this May.

HOLY WEEK 2019

Queen of All Saints Parish Lenten Reflection Responding to the Call of Discipleship

~ Week of April 14th, 2019 ~

Theme: *Go and make disciples*

Scripture: Matthew 28:19, *“Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit.”*

Reflection: The great commission

Jesus gave this command to the apostles shortly before he ascended into heaven. It essentially outlines what those of us who follow him are expected to do. He spent thirty-three years on earth working for the day when his followers, taught by his example, redeemed by his blood and assured by his resurrection, would go out as his witness to the world. The command to “make disciples” means to go out and invite others to meet Christ, and then teach and train them to follow and obey Him. It could be spreading the good news to a neighbor or sharing with the less fortunate children down the street. Who has God put in your heart to share the gifts of salvation? What small or large steps can you take, with the knowledge that Christ will be by your side? You were taught. Will you pick up the mantle for the following generations?

Our life must be lived with eternity in view. As the simple poem goes, “Only one life will soon be past, only what is done for Christ will last.” -C.T. Studd.

Practice: Almsgiving, Prayer and Fasting

Virtue: Justice and Joy

Examples:

- Be courageous, yet compassionate in calling people to be faithful to the gospel.
- Ask others about their hopes and dreams, as well as support them in their efforts to attain.
- Commit yourself to learning about Catholicism and share your understanding with others.
- Be present for those struggling or in emotional pain or despair.
- Spread the good news with joy in your heart and evangelize when the opportunity presents itself.
- Intervene in situations where people are clearly doing wrong to themselves or others.
- Respond to cynicism, skepticism, and doubt with hope.
- Keep a prayer on your lips, do what you can and leave the rest to Him.

This fall, thanks to the generosity of our parishioners to the Capital Campaign, the completely renovated Benedict Center will reopen. Brand new classrooms will greet our preschoolers, SPRED will have a new dedicated gathering space and the parish will have new meeting rooms. State-of-the-art technology and safety enhancements are also part of the planned upgrades. *Let's Raise the Paddle to help Connect the Community by raising \$60,000 to complete these advancements.**

Safety

- Doors are electronically connected directly to the alarm company and City of Chicago.

Thank you for all you do for our parish.

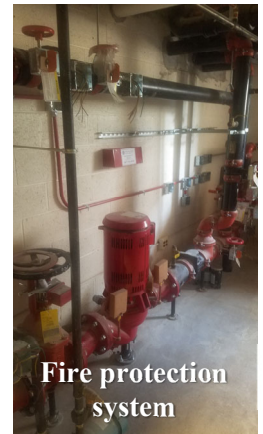
Today's Readings

The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year, at 1:30pm. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A Baptismal Preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must also be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.
