FROM FATHER SIMON



What a difference a week makes! On Palm Sunday we were shoveling snow and on Easter Sunday bright sunshine and warm weather brought many of our parishioners and visitors in their festive finery to celebrate hope and promise of new life. On Palm Sunday, although we sang our Hosannas, we left the church in a somber mood having heard an account of the Passion. On Easter Sunday, with joy and gladness we raised our Alleluias! What a difference a week makes!

To get from Palm Sunday to Easter, we had to go through the three most sacred days in the life of the Church - the Triduum. The celebrations of these days are central to the life of the Church and our identity. The liturgies of these days are rich in symbolism and meaning and are beautiful expressions of our faith. It takes extra effort and attention to detail to preside at these liturgies and I am first of all grateful to all of the priests who prepared and celebrated these days with the dignity and diligence these days require.

Music during these days sets the mood, raises our spirits and lifts up celebration to the heavenly realms. I want to thank our music director, Dr. Ken Sotak, and the members of the choir, for all of the preparation they have done to be able to assist us in worshipping God as best we can. Everyone who is involved in our music program has spent many hours here - your efforts have been worth it!

I thank our altar servers, who have put so much effort into these celebrations, showing up for practices and taking notes. Their dedication and discipline added to the solemnity of the liturgies. I also want to thank those many people who step forward to see to the details of these days, including our sacristans, lectors, Eucharistic ministers and ushers. Those who take care of our liturgical environment spend long hours throughout the year to enhance our worship experience, carrying around plants and hauling full containers of water long after everyone else has gone home. At this time of year the fruit of their labors is especially evident. On behalf of the entire parish, I express my gratitude to Mary Asnis, Gia DiCarlo and their band of helpers. A special word of thanks to Paul Scavone who makes sure that the liturgies of the Triduum are truly for the faithful, not just a well-organized celebration, but an experience of the mysteries of our faith.

In the spirit of gratitude, please join me in thanking Fr. Bob Heidenreich as he celebrates fifty years of priestly service to the people of the Archdiocese of Chicago. Fr. Heidenreich has been helping us with Masses on the weekends. Thank you Father Heidenreich for your priestly ministry – as associate pastor, pastor and administrator. Thank you for being a priest to the people of this parish and a brother priest to me.

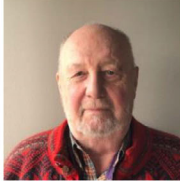

SCHOOL COUNCIL NOMINEES

Following the Masses next weekend, May 4 & 5, you can choose which candidates you would like to see added to QAS School Council Board.



JOHN GORBY: I am a reasonably good listener and problem solver. I tend to be conservative in the sense of “not fixing it if it ain’t broken” and would support the School in its emphasis on developing a sound commitment to Christian principles and virtues, how to learn, and a love of learning. In the long run, these principles and skills are invaluable to long-term success. To the extent my background experience could help QAS School achieve its goals, I would be honored to serve on the School Council.



BARB GRAHAM: My objective as a school council member is to continue working in marketing to assist in our growing enrollment. I have been the marketing spokesperson for the past two years. I spend many hours working on our school showcases that allow prospective students and families a full immersion tour of QAS and how it operates on a typical school day. My flexible schedule is ideal for a council member. I am accessible to the administration whenever there is a need. 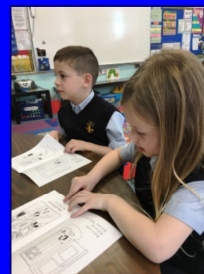

The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year, at 1:30pm. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A Baptismal Preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must also be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.
