FROM FATHER SIMON



There are fewer more nurturing words than ‘time to eat’. Having someone to care enough to cook a meal to feed body and soul is welcome indeed. So Jesus’ invitation to his disciples “come and have breakfast” after a long night of fishing must have been an irresistible invitation. This weekend one hundred twenty-three of our second graders were invited to the table to receive the Eucharist, the gift of Christ Himself, for the first time. Encouraged by their parents and prepared by their teachers they joyfully accepted the invitation. I want to thank their parents, grandparents, godparents, sponsors, teachers and all who have helped make this day special for our children. Accepting that invitation is all that is asked of us. Who doesn’t want breakfast cooked for them?

In about two weeks, we will gather as a community, under a majestic white tent, on a sprawling green field, *to celebrate* the spirit of community that binds us together, *to give thanks* to God for bringing us together as one family, *to remember* and thank all those generous benefactors who have sustained this great parish in the past and who continue to support it in the present and to raise funds *to support* the many ministries and activities of the parish that are essential to our vitality for generations to come.

The UPP, the United Parish Program, is our one and only fundraiser. The UPP aims to bring together the many and varied organizations in the parish and work as one toward a common goal which is to build up the Body of Christ and to care for and support the sacramental, educational and ministerial needs of its members. It is therefore vital that every member of the parish community participates in this united endeavor.

I appeal to every family in the parish – and we have 2900 families – to join in and support the UPP. There are many ways in which to participate in addition to buying a ticket and attending. You could be a sponsor, take out an advertisement in the event booklet, offer an item for auction, buy raffle tickets, or help one of the many committees preparing for the event. Our goal is to raise \$275,000 to support our parish activities. That’s a lot of money but we can do it with the help of every single family in the parish. You can even donate online!

In addition, as you all know, we are in the final stages of Phase One of our Capital Campaign, which includes the expansion of the usage of the Benedict Center. The RAISE THE PADDLE segment of the UPP is to help with the cost of installing new state-of-the-art multimedia systems, cameras inside and around the building, a new buzz-in security system, a secured access system to close off the school area from the other areas of the building, a dedicated alarm system that directly connects to the Chicago Fire Department and other features to make this building a safe environment for the education of our young and for our various adult ministries which will use other areas of the building.

I am deeply grateful to Moira Dargis, MaryBeth Jirgal, Laura Herbert and Laurie Vlasic, who are coordinating this year’s Field of Dreams and the many volunteers on different committees who are working hard to make this day successful and memorable. Their hard work and your generosity and support will enable us to achieve our goal. I look forward to seeing you on May 17 on our Field of Dreams!

FROM THE SCHOOL

SCHOOL COUNCIL NOMINEES

In the vestibule this weekend you can vote for the four candidates you would like to see added to the QAS School Council Board.



JOHN GORBY: I am a reasonably good listener and problem solver. I tend to be conservative in the sense of “not fixing it if it ain’t broken” and would support the School in its emphasis on developing a sound commitment to Christian principles and virtues, how to learn, and a love of learning. In the long run, these principles and skills are invaluable to long-term success. To the extent my background experience could help QAS School achieve its goals, I would be honored to serve on the School Council.



BARB GRAHAM: My objective as a school council member is to continue working in marketing to assist in our growing enrollment. I have been the marketing spokesperson for the past two years. I spend many hours working on our school showcases that allow prospective students and families a full immersion tour of QAS and how it operates on a typical school day. My flexible schedule is ideal for a council member. I am accessible to the administration whenever there is a need. My background as a Catholic school teacher provides a fundamental understanding of how QAS thrives both academically and spiritually.



JOHN HALL: I am finishing a three-year term on the school council (2 of which were as Chairman), where I led efforts for finance committee and helped ensure a balanced budget for the school. I am looking to finish my efforts to work closely with the Principal to ensure that financially the school continues to be in good shape as well as all initiatives we as a council have been working on are implemented. This includes updating curriculum, constantly improving technology, improve the school in all areas and grow enrollment through the renovation.



BERNIE HENRY: As a graduate of QAS and parent of a current student, I have both a history and a future with the school. I feel I have skills applicable to most of the committees, and as a member of the QAS School Council, my primary objective would be to help develop policies to fight against headwinds of declining enrollment trends in Catholic education by building on the strong academic foundation while preserving our Catholic identity.



JOHN LINN: My goals as a member of school council would be to continue the efforts to improve the students’ experience in academics, faith formation, and personal growth. It’s an exciting time to be involved with QAS with the new physical space renovations and upgrades, as we have an opportunity to grow and sustain our strong enrollment for the future. My efforts would focus on enrollment growth and improving student interactions with each other in the spirit of our Catholic faith.



SUZANNE MCENEELY: I am a parent of two boys at QAS and I have been an active volunteer at the school and parish. I am involved in WAX (Treasurer), UPP (co-chair for decorations) and Art in Action. I would like to see the school continue to grow and be the cornerstone of the foundation of this community. I’d like to see growth in the educational offerings including more emphasis on STEM.



TIM O'MAHOONEY: My goal is to continue to be of service to a great school and to continue the work I have done the last 3 years on the legislative committee of the School Council, and to be of service in any other way needed.

We are approaching the end of Phase I of our comprehensive renovation and repurposing of the Benedict Center. This included:

- State-of-the-art classrooms for our 3 and 4 year old early childhood education programs
- New gathering spaces for our adult ministries
- All new electrical wiring, plumbing and HVAC
- Dedicated space for our Special Religious Education Program
- Enhanced fire safety and security features, plus elevator access for the elderly and disabled

We now look ahead to Phase II and Phase III of our campaign:

- The renovation of the former kindergarten space for use by our larger ministries, including Men's Club and Women's Auxiliary
- Reconfiguration of classrooms, library and music program into updated and more appropriate space
- Finally, the creation of a flexible parish community hall in the former Rose Room, restoring that space to its original function

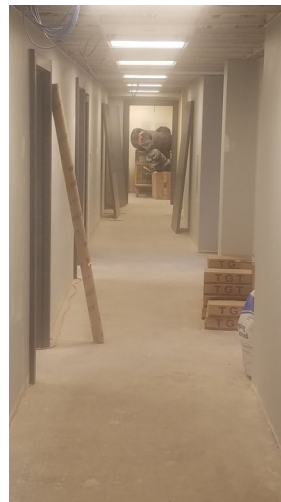
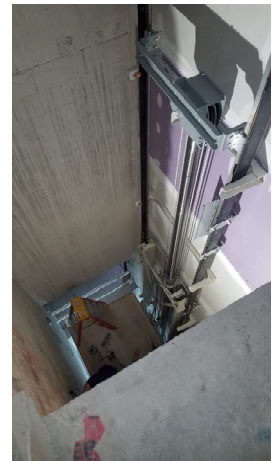

The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year, at 1:30pm. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A Baptismal Preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must also be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.

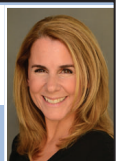
