I am Fr. Walter Cheboi, a Catholic priest from the Catholic Diocese of Eldoret in Kenya. I was born on October 5th, 1974, a second-born in a humble family of nine (five boys, four girls), of my living mother, Coletta, and father, Peter Cheboi, who passed on in 2001. I was ordained a diocesan priest on June 22nd, 2002. In the seventeen years of my

priesthood, I have worked as assistant pastor for three years, as a pastor in two parishes for about eleven years, and as Director of Vocations in the diocese while performing my duties as a Dean. I came to the United States in May of 2017 and I have been a graduate student, MA in Social Justice at Loyola University Chicago from where I graduated on May 7, 2019.

I am grateful, honored, and thrilled for the opportunity to serve the Queen of All Saints Basilica community, to experience God's love, discern God's will, grow and journey with all of you in faith. Being my first time to minister in the United States, I intend to learn from and with you, pray, interact, and be in communion with you while collaborating in discharging my priestly duties with Fr. Simon and fellow priests in the parish, to achieve the mission and goals laid down by the Church, at Queen of All Saints parish. I believe that God will dispense graces through the service to us all as we ponder, generously share, and enjoy God's abundant and wondrous gifts to us as disciples and stewards in the Lord's vineyard. I also believe that with your prayers, cooperation and support, we will serve our Lord, realize the fruits of love and service, and comfort and joy of being at the center of God's will.

Again, I am excited to join you, live and shepherd among you, and celebrate God's presence among us with you. For God is Good, all the time...And all the time, God is Good!

STATUS OF OUR CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

We have almost completed the construction of Phase 1 of our capital campaign, the near total rebuilding of the Benedict Center. Once we get occupancy of that building we will be able to move back in during the summer and complete the transformation of that space from a 20% use of a long-neglected building to a 100% use of state-of-the-art early childhood education classrooms and an assortment of comfortable meeting spaces for our growing adult ministries.

This is a dream come true for a parish that values its children. It is also a necessity for a parish with so many adults who wish a deeper involvement in learning about their faith and in living their faith.

But as we catch our breath at the completion of Phase 1 we immediately pivot to Phases 2 and 3, the renovation of space in our Lemont and Keene Avenue buildings for use by our school, renovating the former kindergarten space into the largest new space for our adult ministries, and finally concluding with the restoration of the former Rose Room in the basement of the Lemont building to its original purpose – a parish hall!



All of this comes, of course, at a price. Anyone who has gone through a home renovation knows the expense that comes with progress, even with good planning and careful oversight. Our project is certainly no exception, and we also have the extra cost of building for long-term and very heavy use, plus the cost of unexpected construction surprises inherent in older buildings.



But right now I have two urgent requests.

First, as we have already noted very often in our progress reports in the bulletin and elsewhere, the final cost of all our needed improvements will be at least \$6 million. We have received pledges of direct donations to our parish of roughly \$5.2 million. We have collected 61% of those pledges to date, but the pace of collections has slowed due in large part to the multi-year nature of those pledges. We always keep a close eye on our ultimate costs and the most cost-effective way to complete our dreams is to continue our pace of construction and that will

require us to accelerate our pace of pledge collections. Please make every effort to stay current on your donation to our parish and even perhaps to complete your donation early. There may also be some tax advantages under the new tax reform laws to accelerate the total payment of your donation this year in 2019.

Second, as we noted above, there is still a gap between donations to the parish and our final cost. Our fundraising effort remains open to those whose circumstances may have improved since their initial pledge or who may feel more confident in making an initial pledge or increasing their earlier pledge. If you are able, please stretch your commitment to our parish's future by making or increasing your direct donation to our parish. All of us have benefitted from the efforts of others, from both the distant past and from the more recent past. It is time for all of us to stand as one as we strengthen our parish for the bright and hopeful future we all share.





The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year, at 1:30pm. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A Baptismal Preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must also be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.


