FROM FATHER SIMON



It all began in March of 2014 when Msgr. Pollard gathered the leadership of the parish to assess the space needed to support the many ministries of the parish. Among the many proposals was a comprehensive renovation of the Benedict Center as well as some areas in the Lemont and Keene buildings to address the growing demands for meeting spaces and make the necessary improvements to our school so that we can provide the best atmosphere and facilities for our children to grow and learn.

In order to finance this project we initiated the Capital Campaign *From Generation to Generation* as part of the Archdiocesan Campaign *To Teach Who Christ Is*. The generosity of a number of our parish families enabled us to begin the realization of this dream in September 2018. In just ten months we completed Phase I and we are hopeful that by the end of August 2019 we will have completed Phase II of the project.

We had a great turnout for the Open House of the Benedict Center on July 7. Many of you were able to see the transformation of the pre-school area, the new meeting spaces, a dedicated space for our SPRED program and improvements to enhance the accessibility, safety and security of the building. Here are the answers to some of your questions we promised to address:

- The timeless-leaded windows on the east side of the building are retained to maintain the character of the building. The window frames will be cleaned and painted.
- The landscaping around the building will be restored and new planting will be added.
- The elevator can be accessed from the north entrance. This entry is handicap-accessible. The elevator will ONLY service the second and third floors. A key is needed to access the first floor and the lower level. This is a security measure that has been put into place so that adults who use the building during the day WILL NOT be able to access the areas designated for use by the school.
- The above is also true with regard to the security doors on the second floor. They are programmed to open in the event of a fire or power failure. Should anyone attempt to force entry to the other side, an alarm will go off in the building and at the Chicago Fire Department. The safety of our children is of primary concern.

We are proud of the work we have done so far and we hope that many of you will have the opportunity to attend a meeting or event in the near future and be able to see the beauty inside.

As we are nearing the completion of Phase II and prepare for Phase III, I appeal to you to continue fulfilling your pledge and even consider increasing your pledge amount. To those who are behind or haven't started payments, please do so soon. We depend on the fulfillment of all pledges to continue and finish the project on time. To those who haven't pledged, I ask you to consider making a donation towards this project. A BIG THANK YOU to all of you who have contributed to help us realize the continuation and completion of the goals of our campaign *From Generation to Generation*.

A word about the Gospel for this weekend... Jesus enjoys the hospitality of his friends Martha and Mary. Much ink has been used to exalt the role of Mary over Martha because she is seen as the more spiritual, the more contemplative, while Martha is often seen as the disciple consumed with worldly cares, easily distracted by "life." The words of Jesus that "Mary chose the better part" have often been interpreted by many as to mean that there is a hierarchical divide between the spiritual life and the active life, our life in the "secular" world. This perpetuates an incorrect and unhealthy notion that many busy people like

us who live and work out there in the “secular” world could not be spiritual, and that “spiritual” people couldn’t live in this world, and love this world.

We might want to consider what we have heard in the gospel just a couple of weeks ago to help us understand this passage. We heard that Jesus ‘resolutely determined to go to Jerusalem’. Jerusalem is the place where he will encounter his passion, death and resurrection. At that moment he is probably troubled and could surely use a listening ear. He finds in Mary a perfect companion. A big hearty meal is probably the last thing on his mind. It may be more than exalting Mary’s role and admonishing Martha. It is about what is needed *at the moment*. Remember last week – the Good Samaritan is the one who does what is needed at the moment. Love is about answering the specific need of the other. It is more than what we want to do – it is what the other needs from us at that moment.

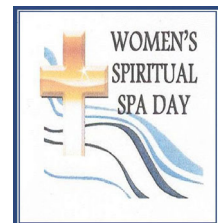

The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year, at 1:30pm. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A Baptismal Preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must also be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.
