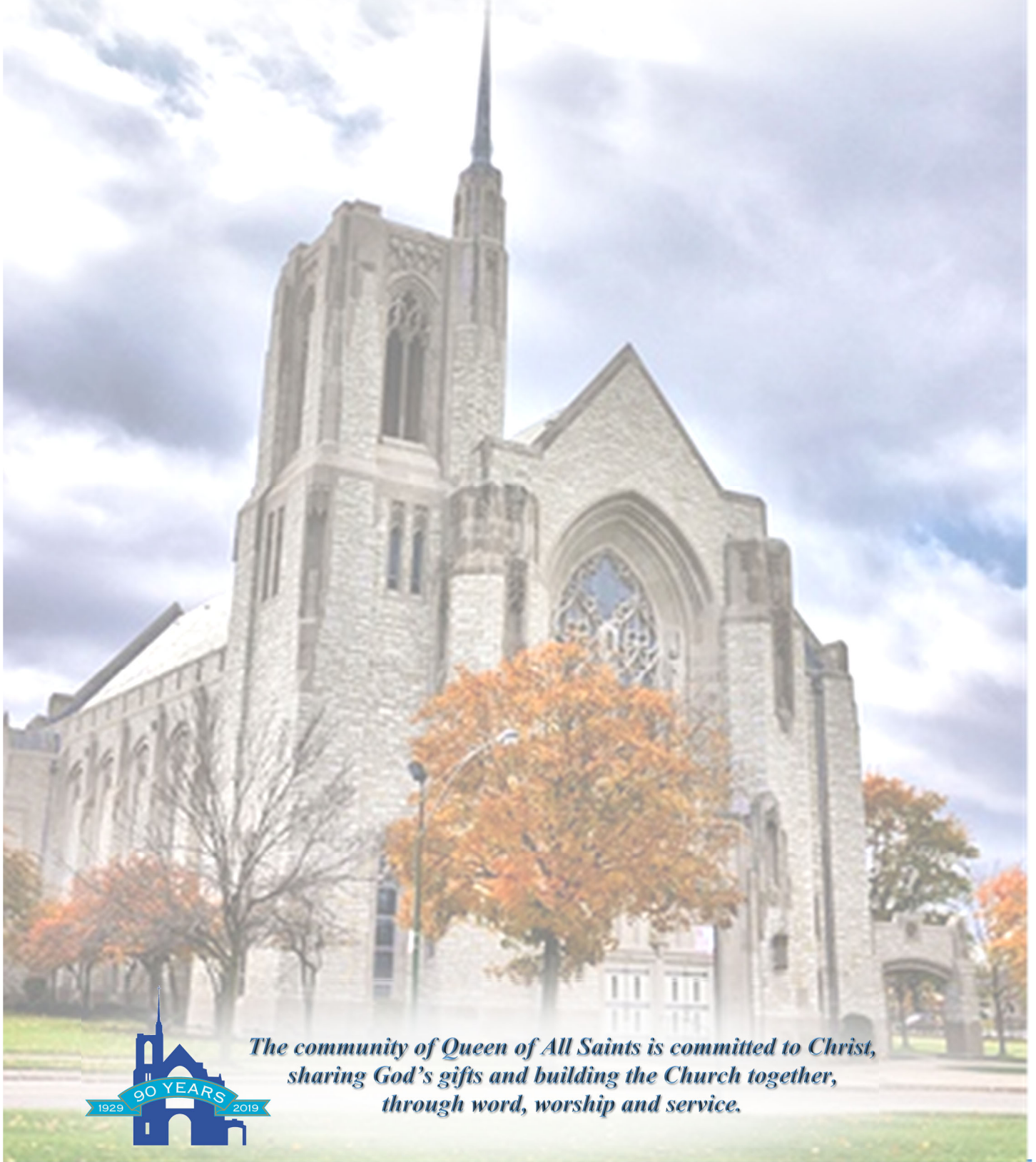

FROM FR. SIMON



We are aware that according to the gospels, Jesus raised three people from the dead – the widow’s son, the daughter of Jairus and his friend Lazarus. None of them who have been raised from the dead tell us what heaven is like, or what happened to them. We are left completely in the dark. As human beings, when we talk about, think about, argue about, wonder about eternal life, afterlife, resurrection of the dead – you think it is heresy city – you have some of the most interesting answers.

There are many opinions about resurrection. Some people say that there is no continuity or connection between life, death and resurrection. Death is the end. There is nothing else to look forward to. It makes no difference how I live; this is all there is.

Others believe in resurrection but they grit their teeth and endure life. Everything here is unhappy. The world is a bad place. Suffer now and get the reward later! Our earthly life doesn’t matter because our true home is in heaven.

A wiser approach is to see life, death and resurrection as continuous and connected. This has implications for the choices that we make in life. Life is a ‘dry run’ for eternity. When we pray, “Thy Kingdom come,” we are praying that all of us as individuals and as a human family will be transformed into more just and loving people, now, as well as in the world to come.

Heaven is a continuation and a deepening of the choices that we make for life. Only then does it make sense that we become courageous in the face of death. We face death because of the certain hope we have that in God no one is ever lost. This approach is borne out in today’s first reading and the gospel, which speak clearly of God’s promise to raise the just to life after death.

God’s desire is that people live their present lives to the fullest, modelled on the life, message and witness of Jesus. By doing so, all people will be raised up with Jesus. Resurrection is a way of living, now and forever! Faith in the resurrection conveys the message that there is more to life than meets the eye. Let us pray for courage and for hope in the resurrection. What happened to Jesus will also happen to us who follow him. We can then live *with a certain amount of hope, a certain amount of daring, a certain amount of adventure and a certain amount of confidence.*

On this weekend as we celebrate Veterans Day, do not forget to give thanks to and for those who defend our freedom. I ask you to pray for all veterans, especially those whose lives are scarred by the wounds of battle and those who are haunted by the experiences of combat, for they gave up their ‘today’ for our ‘tomorrow’ so that we can dare to hope, live in freedom and be adventurous as we go on with our lives.

Follow up to the Appeal for Increased Offering

Last weekend, I made an appeal from the pulpit for a significant increase in our Sunday offertory giving. “Stewardship” is a way to understand and deepen our relationship with the Lord since it involves the intentional, planned and proportionate giving of our time, talent and treasure. Our Increased Offertory Appeal calls on all parishioners to reflect on one part of stewardship, their gift of “treasure” to the parish.

Like any household, our parish each year looks at income and expenses to estimate what we can afford for parish, school and religious education operations and ongoing or new programs. While a slight increase in our Sunday offering last year has enabled us to keep up with normal salary and cost increases, we must consider it our sacred duty to be grateful to the past, mindful of the present and hopeful and committed to the future in an open and honest way. In anticipation of our centenary celebrations, we have set ourselves a realistic goal to replenish our endowments by a minimum of five (5) million dollars. We owe this to ourselves since we have recently borrowed from our endowments to pay for the much needed repairs to the basilica ceiling and bell tower.

The realization of this goal would be much easier if all parishioners committed to a significant and sustained increase in their weekly offering to the parish. This would enable us to more accurately anticipate our income and budget accordingly. It would help you, too, to budget your offering in the spirit of Stewardship. The method of payment is certainly up to you. Most parishioners fulfill their commitment weekly using church envelopes placed in the Sunday Collection. A growing number of parishioners now use online giving by clicking on the Give Central button on the parish website.

Please be as generous to the parish as you are able. I am extremely appreciative of everyone’s past generosity to the parish and am certain of our ability to respond to this new call. I thank you in advance for your support, understanding and kindness.

Becoming An Everyday Contemplative

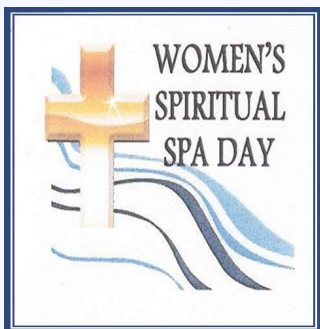

How can we become more mindful and reflective amid noise and distractions of contemporary life? We will explore some of the simple practices from our great but often overlooked Catholic monastic tradition, and discover how we can incorporate these practices into our daily lives in order to see “the real behind the real” and “the story behind the story” of our lives. Through individual reflection and discussion in small groups, we will leave with a new vision of ourselves as “everyday contemplatives.”

Judith Valente is the author of four spirituality titles, including most recently *How To Live: What the Rule of St. Benedict Teaches Us About Happiness, Meaning and Community*. She is the co-author of *The Art of Pausing: Meditations for the Overworked and Overwhelmed* and of *Twenty Poems to Nourish Your Soul*. She has also written two collections of poetry. She worked previously for PBS-TV, Chicago Public Radio, The Wall Street Journal and The Washington Post. She contributes articles to U.S. Catholic magazine and National Catholic Reporter. Her easily accessible, yet poetic style of presenting has made her a popular speaker and retreat and workshop leader across the country. Her other books include *Atchison Blue: A Search for Silence, A Spiritual Home and A Living Faith*, the memoir of her time at Mount St. Scholastica Monastery in Atchison, Kansas. She is an Oblate (lay associate) of Mount St. Scholastica. She currently lives in Normal, IL and is married to former Illinois Circuit Court Judge Charles Reynard.

This season 50 runners participated in the program and led the Saints to their best season yet. The boys team ended the season with a 7th place finish at the Illinois Elementary School Association state meet. After taking 2nd place at the sectional meet, the girls team went on to win the first ever State Championship for QAS. Morgan Mackie finished 1st among the field of 228 runners. Running the two mile race in 11 minutes and 32 seconds, she finished 17 seconds ahead of the 2nd place runner. 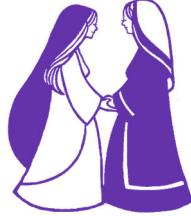

Stewardship — Our Sunday Offerings

Last Sunday we heard Father Simon speak at all the Masses on an important Stewardship topic, one that has been mentioned frequently on this page.

We are blessed to have this beautiful basilica for our shared worship at Mass, for our sacramental lives including Baptisms, First Communions, Confirmations, Marriages and simply for quiet moments of prayer and inspiration.

We were also blessed that those who came before us provided a temporary safety net in the event of unexpected capital expenses such as the recent needs to replace the basilica ceiling and to make major repairs to our bell tower.

Thanks to their generosity we were able to “borrow from ourselves” to fund these projects and other serious water-related repairs quickly and properly.

Now having borrowed from ourselves we now owe it to ourselves to replenish our savings and restore our financial footing.

We have established a goal to add \$5 million to our savings over the next 10 years. This will require an increase in our Sunday collections of at least 25% over our current collections.

Please consider how much our parish means to you and how you can do your part.

By doing our part today we honor our past and we provide for our shared future.

The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year, at 1:30pm. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A Baptismal Preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must also be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.

TODAY'S READINGS
