

FROM FATHER SIMON



This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. Since 1925, when Pope Pius XI instituted this feast, the Church has made a strong statement time and again as we close our liturgical year. The message, in the midst of decades of change, remains simple: “Our King is Christ. His Kingship is different from all those before and to come. It is unlike anything with which we are otherwise familiar. Jesus Christ rules, not with political power or military might. He rules as one of us.”

To proclaim Christ king over all is one thing. To proclaim him as our king—or rather, for each of us to profess him as king over our individual lives—is yet another. Personal ownership of Christ’s kingship is to place the precious daily moments of our lives at his feet. For most of us this proves considerably more challenging than mounting a public outcry over the condition of society as a whole.

In order to truly embrace surrender to Christ as one’s king there are difficult questions that we have to ask ourselves. The answers are seldom comfortable, and are not often easy to face. Today, as we remember who it is that is king of our very lives, we must ask ourselves: Is Christ the king of my life?

Jesus seeks to explain to his disciples that they must not follow the example of those who lord it over others. By contrast they are not to make their presence felt. Rather, their greatness will arise from being at the service of others. This turns the tables on their preconceived notions. The disciples did not find it easy to accept this change or practice what it implied.

It is not surprising then that today we are still struggling to put into practice the very radical nature of Jesus’ invitation to follow him. Even those in authority in the Church are tempted to forget the fundamental principle that Jesus’ kingdom is one of love and service.

When Jesus is dying on the cross he appears to have succumbed to the forces of this world. The leaders of the people mock him. They challenge him to disarm them and take control. Even one of the criminals crucified with him questions his authority and the effectiveness of his power. To all appearances his mission has completely failed, and his kingdom disintegrated. However, in faith we know that the tragedy of the cross is the moment of triumph for the kingdom, because the forces of this world can never conquer the human heart. It is in the hearts of women and men of faith and goodwill that the kingdom of God is established. Jesus can speak, then, of the kingdom of God already being among us.

Jesus came to enable us to become the people the Father intended us to be. The other criminal who recognized the goodness and innocence of Jesus opens his heart to the gospel message as he asks for a place in the kingdom. Immediately he is rewarded with the promise of paradise. That promise remains good for us and our world. It cannot be forced on us, nor can we force it upon others.

FROM FATHER SIMON

This weekend at the 5pm Mass 110 of our eighth-graders will be part of the Rite of Enrollment. This is a ceremony in which the candidates make their official commitment to enter into preparations for the sacrament of Confirmation. Prior to the Rite of Enrollment candidates are asked to seriously and prayerfully think about what will be required of them during this time of preparation.

Each candidate will sign a covenant form in which they promise to willingly and actively participate in this time of discovery and formation. They are invited to ask questions and share their faith. This is a wonderful time in their life to reflect on and grow in their personal faith, and learn more about what it means to be Catholic.

For our part, we as a community promise our prayers as they prepare for this important moment in their lives. Please pick a card and pray for these young people or if you know someone who is preparing for Confirmation, please pray for them. You may also drop off a personal note or card for them at the rectory to assure them of your prayerful remembrance. These young people need our support and prayers as they prepare to commit themselves to be witnesses of Christ and lead others to Him.

Take a look outside at our bell tower, where scaffolding still holds workers repairing and replacing tons of brick and stones which have been damaged by our Chicago winters.

This is the time to give thanks to those who came before us, who prudently set aside savings for us to borrow from if we had a sudden need to make necessary repairs.

This is the time to show respect to those whose generosity has enabled us to keep our shared worship space in good repair.

In particular, this is the time for each of us to respond to the call to pay back that borrowing, to be a part of our effort to replace \$5 million back into savings over the next 10 years through a 25% or more increase in our Sunday collections today.

The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year, at 1:30pm. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A Baptismal Preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must also be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.
