OUR HISTORY

We began as a parish of only 40 families in 1929, but grew quickly thanks to the dedication and generosity of our early parishioners who built our church and school to what you see today. In recognition of our parish's distinctive heritage and identity our church was elevated to the dignity of a basilica by St. Pope John XXIII in 1962 and today is one of only three basilicas in the Archdiocese of Chicago.

WHO WE ARE NOW

Today, we have nearly 2,900 households, with over 9,500 parishioners. Together we participate in many outreach, educational and worship ministries for the benefit of our fellow parishioners as well as the local and global communities that we serve.

Our basilica is focused in celebrating the Catholic faith, in word, worship and service. Our parish school has a healthy enrollment of over 600 students and our religious education program enrolls just over 300 students in the study and practice of our faith.

Look upwards and you will see a new ceiling. The original ceiling had to be replaced in 2017 due to accumulated water damage. Look outside and see the scaffolding where we are repairing our bell tower, after suffering the effects of Chicago winters. Beyond the Classroom

QAS third-grade students got more than a basic music lesson during a recent class. At the beginning of class students were able to listen to a live performance of J.S. Bach's Toccata and Fugue in D Minor. This particular piece of music was written for the pipe organ. The students were very interested in the pipe organ and asked a lot of questions.

Fortunately, Queen of All Saints Basilica is home to an extraordinary pipe organ containing over 3,300 pipes, which gave music teacher Sheila Chovanec an idea. Mrs. Chovanec arranged a tour of the organ with QAS Music Director Ken Sotak. Dr. Sotak gave the students a tour of the organ and the rooms where the biggest pipes and wind machine are located. He explained how the organ and pipes work to create their beautiful sound. The students had the opportunity to ask questions and hear the Bach piece played live. Before the tour ended, each student had a chance to play the organ. The third grade students said it was the best music class!

SCHOOL NEWS



Dear Parishioner,

Queen of All Saints School is grateful to you for supporting the advancement of Catholic school education. I am writing about a unique opportunity for Archdiocese of Chicago Catholic schools. The State of Illinois created a tax credit scholarship program through the “Invest in Kids” Act that is mutually beneficial to students and donors. It provides a 75 percent Illinois State income tax credit to individuals who contribute money to fund scholarships for students to attend private schools. Eligible students from low-income families in Illinois may use these scholarships to attend a non-public school of their choice, including the more than 200 Archdiocese of Chicago Catholic schools in Cook and Lake Counties.

To increase the funds available for scholarships next year, several donors have partnered with the scholarship granting organization Empower Illinois and the Archdiocese of Chicago to create a matching gift pool.

- Every dollar donated to this program through Empower Illinois between Dec. 1, 2019 and Feb. 29, 2020 and designated to a school operated by the Archdiocese of Chicago will be matched with two dollars from this pool (limitations apply). The program will end when all matching funds have been depleted or on Feb. 29, 2020, whichever comes first.
- A \$5,000 donation will have a tremendous impact. With the 75 percent tax credit you receive on the donation and this match, it will have a net cost to you of \$1,250 and will provide \$15,000 in scholarships for low-income families.
- After April 1, 2020, any matching gift program funds that are not awarded at a designated school will be reallocated to low-income students at schools with unmet demand.
- Donors who would like to receive the tax credit for their 2019 taxes should begin the process prior to Dec. 16, 2019 to ensure they have enough time to make their gift by Dec. 31, 2019.

We also want to share with you this message from Cardinal Blase J. Cupich, Archbishop of Chicago, regarding the importance of the tax credit scholarship program. Please visit <https://schools.archchicago.org/tax-credit-scholarships>

The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year, at 1:30pm. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A Baptismal Preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must also be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.
