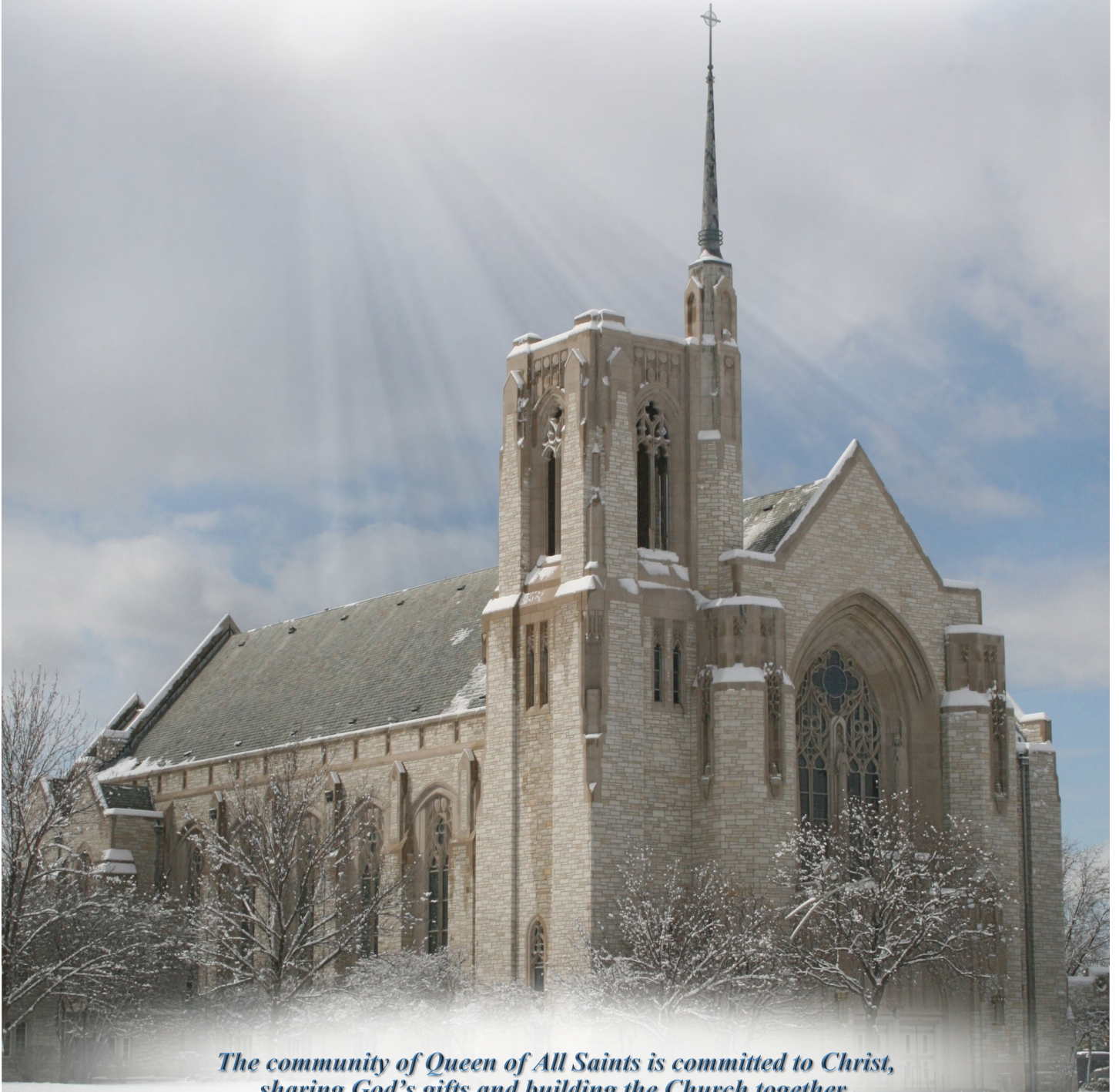

FROM FATHER SIMON



Almost two million students in close to 6,400 Catholic elementary and secondary schools all over the country, including 200 in the Archdiocese of Chicago, will celebrate Catholic Schools Week from January 26 to February 1 with special Masses, community service projects, academic and artistic showcases and athletic and family events.

The theme “Catholic Schools: Learn. Serve. Lead. Succeed.” encompasses the core values and results that can be found in Catholic schools across the country. Not only are we teaching students to become future servant leaders, faith-filled disciples and enriched citizens in our communities, we, as educators, are growing with them. In Catholic schools we are all learners, servants and leaders. These shared qualities are what make Catholic schools work. They are what make Catholic schools succeed.

The theme focuses on key elements of Catholic education: faith development, academic excellence and dedication to service. These elements set Catholic schools apart from other educational options. They are why families make sacrifices to provide their children with a Catholic education.

As I thank you parents for your sacrifice and commitment to Catholic education, I bring to your attention words from the special blessing given to the father of a child at baptism, “He and his wife will be the first teachers of their child in the ways of faith.” The first educators in the faith are parents. It is you, above all others, who establish in your children the first sensitivity and responsiveness to the presence of God, to the practice of prayer and to the patterns of life in the community of faith, the parish. By your example in the home and in your participation in the Mass and other sacraments, the foundations of life-long faith and discipleship in your children are laid down.

According to the 2014 report of Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate at Georgetown University, surveys of parents reveal that the top three reasons parents give for choosing Catholic education - and the not inconsiderable cost involved - are quality religious education, a safe environment for learning, and quality academic instruction.

That we have schools where kids excel academically is a great achievement and I am grateful to our Principal Mrs. Emily Carlson, our Assistant Principal Mrs. Amy Moore, and our dedicated faculty and staff that make Queen of All Saints a place where parents want to send their children.

The education of a child in a Catholic School is a huge investment of time, talent and treasure, not only by parents but also by the parish community. Sometimes it is good to take time to consider “how our investment” has been doing. You are all investors in our Catholic school.

Over the last couple of years, we have made significant improvements to our school facilities through our Capital Campaign Project, including the total transformation of the Benedict Center for the benefit of our early childhood education program, as well as major enhancements to the Keene and Lemont buildings. In addition to these major capital investments is the yearly cost of maintenance, repairs and ordinary operations of the buildings used by our school, which now

amounts to about \$340,000 dollars paid from parish operations and another \$300,000 drawn from the endowment. It is fair to say that every student who enters Queen of All Saints School receives a scholarship of \$1,000 annually, from the generosity of our parishioners to help school parents bear the cost of Catholic education. It's our investment in our children, the future of our society and the future of our Church.

Key questions we all face today are “will our children keep their Catholic faith?” and “where will we find leaders, lay and ordained, for our parishes in the future?” To my mind, the top “benefit” by which our investment should be measured is in how well Catholic schools do in the formation of knowledgeable and active Catholic adults. I am proud to say that one of our recent graduates Lily McManamy (class of 2017) was honored last November by the Archdiocesan Council of Women as a ‘future leader in the Church’ and I am very hopeful of the future for her and others like her. So, Yay for Catholic Schools Week! And may each one of us recognize that all of us are called to learn, serve, lead and succeed.

Candlemas Sunday



Sunday, February 2nd, is the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, traditionally known as Candlemas Day. The tradition of Candlemas Day represents the entry of Christ, the light of the world, into the temple of

Jerusalem.

While it is customary for Christians in some countries to remove their Christmas decorations on Twelfth Night (Epiphany Eve), historically others remove them on Candlemas. On Candlemas, many Christians, notably Anglicans, Methodists, Lutherans, Orthodox and Roman Catholics bring their candles to their local church, where they are blessed and then used for the rest of the year. Bringing the candle into the home is a sign that Christ is with you in your everyday life.

In celebration of this feast, everyone is invited to bring candles from home to be blessed at Mass on the weekend of February 1st and 2nd.

Stewardship - Understanding our Parish Finances

We are asking for a significant increase in our Sunday collections and believe that any request for support must be based on a well-documented need.

We rely on three main sources of funds:

Sundays, Holidays, UPP—This is our regular revenue and is by far the largest source of funds to pay for our parish operations. In a sense, this is what “keeps the lights on” by paying for our staff, our routine repairs and maintenance, and the other day to day costs of running our parish.

Long-Term Savings (our Endowments)—We are blessed with savings resulting from the generosity of those who have gone before us, including our parish and school endowments. The earnings from these accounts is used to supplement our regular revenue to balance our parish and school budgets and, on occasion, to pay for extraordinary repairs. In the last several years we have drawn upon these savings deeply to pay for the unanticipated basilica ceiling project and the bell tower project, and now must take steps to replenish those savings.

Capital Campaign—Our capital campaign drive is carefully designed to make our older parish buildings more suitable for today’s and tomorrow’s needs, including making better use of space for our school and our increasing numbers of lay ministries. Although we have received pledges to date exceeding our original drive goal of \$5 million we also encountered hidden and unforeseen construction problems that forced an increase in the project budget, which must be funded through savings.

To restore our parish savings, which is an essential safety net for our parish future, we have set a goal of replenishing our endowments by \$5 million, by increasing our Sunday collections by a minimum of 25% or through direct contributions to our endowments. (See picture to the right). Please consider how you can help achieve our financial needs, for the present and for the future.

The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated at 1:30pm two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A baptismal preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.

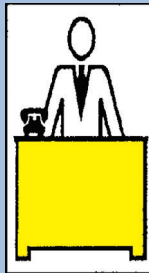
