PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD

FROM FATHER SIMON



With Palm Sunday, we begin the most solemn week of the Christian calendar. The liturgies of Holy Week celebrate the mystery of a divinely extravagant love that lies at the heart of our faith: Jesus' death and resurrection. At this time no public celebrations are permitted almost across the world due to the coronavirus. Social distancing has become part of our vocabulary and lifestyle - however, spiritual distancing should not! Our participation, spiritually at this time, in the Church's liturgy enables us to identify with Jesus in his sufferings in order that we may also share with him the fruits of the resurrection.

This time of Holy Week puts us in touch with the most profound human questions - Why is there so much suffering and evil in the world? Is it really God's will that Jesus should die in such excruciating circumstances? In what way is this death of Jesus the source of our life and salvation?

We need to begin by recognizing not only the present reality of the coronavirus but also the ongoing violence in the world that destroys people's lives – our indifference for the common good, those responsible for human trafficking, death camps, terrorist killings, ethnic cleansing, environmental destruction and the greed-filled corruption of some in power. Jesus and the prophets speak out against this reign of terror which continues to take hold of our world to this day.

Following Jesus to Calvary puts us in touch with another reality: none of us can escape the accusation in which we too play a part in destructive patterns of human behavior. As Jesus said to the angry crowds who were ready to stone the woman accused of adultery: "Let the one without sin cast the first stone".

Reflecting on Jesus' passion, we are invited to recognize our own sinfulness. Unlike Jesus, none of us is the innocent victim. We too can play the scapegoat game which puts all the blame onto others. We should also recognize ourselves in the disciples whose fear and cowardice leave Jesus to suffer and die without their support. How often have we failed to respond to someone in need?

The crucifixion of Jesus is not willed by God as payment for sin and evil. Rather, it invites us to recognize that the power of evil is so great it does not stop with the killing of the Son of God. It shows us that God's healing forgiveness and liberating love have no bounds since, in Christ Jesus, God has "emptied himself, taking the condition of a slave ... accepting death on a cross" in order that we may have life. The resurrection is God's final victory over suffering, sin and death.

Christianity focuses on the cross of Jesus as its central symbol. This does not amount to the glorification of suffering and violence. To the contrary, by inviting us to share in Christ's passion, we are able to confront darkness and sin in the knowledge that these are but passing realities. The cross always points to the resurrection and the promise of eternal life for all who acclaim "Jesus Christ as Lord".

May our Lenten journey, in spirit, lead us to the glory of Easter.

TEXT TO GIVE

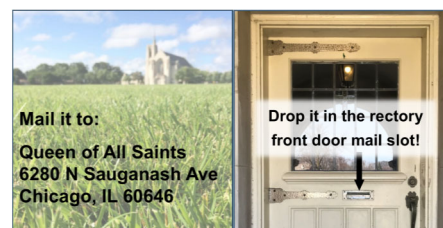
- If you currently have an active GiveCentral account, you may use the cell phone registered to your account to give by text.
 - The phone number to give by text is 773-661-4683.
 - To make a Sunday donation send a text with the keyword “*sundayqas*” followed by an amount (e.g., to **make a \$100 donation to Sunday collections, text: *sundayqas 100***). To make an Easter donation text “easter” followed by the amount. Leave a space between the keyword and the amount.
 - If you do not have a GiveCentral account, you may still text the same way to the same number which will then return a link that will allow you to enter your contact and payment information for your donation.
- At this time, donations may only be made to Sunday and Easter using Text to Give.

FIVE SIMPLE WAYS TO CELEBRATE HOLY WEEK AT HOME

Create a simple prayer space in your home, and gather there to pray during the week.

Palm Sunday: At your regular Mass time, read the first Palm Sunday Gospel (Mt 21:1–11) and meditate on or discuss what Jesus might be thinking as he enters Jerusalem for the last time.

Holy Thursday: Bake bread for sharing at dinner; make a ritual of stripping the dinner table of all cloths and decorations after dinner.

Good Friday: Pray the Stations of the Cross at 3 p.m. or listen online to them led by Fr. Simon.

Holy Saturday: In the morning, read Psalm 64 and break your Good Friday fast solemnly with a simple meal.

Easter Sunday: Dress up the dinner table again. Include candles and crosses, so that the candy baskets aren't the only festive items present. Sing Alleluia and read the Easter Gospel (Matthew 28:1-10) with solemnity and joy.

The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated at 1:30pm two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A baptismal preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.

HOSANNA!

"Hosanna to the Son of David; blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord; hosanna in the highest" (Matthew 21:9). With these words the Church enters the holiest of weeks, commemorating the passion, death, and resurrection of Christ. When the people of Jerusalem cried out with their "hosannas," they were using an ancient Hebrew shout of acclamation that meant "Pray, save us." The king to whom they were shouting eventually would save them, but in a way that would be far from what they expected. Salvation would come from the wood of the cross as Jesus hung there to bring freedom from sin and life through death, opening the gates of heaven for all who put their faith and trust in him.

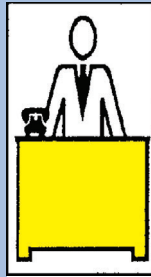
