## FROM FATHER SIMON



Words cannot describe the joy experienced by many who returned to celebrate Mass in the basilica. The inside of the basilica was as magnificent as before (except for a little tape on the pews and signs on the floor and boards reminding us of the safety precautions in place for all to follow). Its beauty was enhanced by the presence of the people of God and the music that lifted our hearts and spirits as we celebrated the Eucharist.

As we continue our efforts reopening our parish for Masses and to make this process safe and hassle-free, I ask for your patience and your commitment to follow the precautionary measures we have in place. This will encourage those who hunger for the Eucharist and are apprehensive to choose to join us.

Please remember that your safety is our primary concern. Your own safety and the safety of others should be your concern as well. If you are ill, please stay at home.

It is mandated by the Archdiocese that those attending Mass are to make a reservation. Please use our website to sign up. If you do not have access to the necessary technology, please call the rectory Monday through Friday between 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. If you do show up without a reservation, we will be able to seat you only if there is a seat available and will require your name and phone number.

At present we are open only for Masses (weekday, weekend and funerals) and confessions. We will soon begin celebrating baptisms. Our Sunday Mass schedule and the cleaning required after Mass does not permit us to celebrate baptisms on Sundays. Instead we will celebrate baptisms on Saturdays at 1:30 p.m. We will limit baptism to no more than four infants at a time. Please note that we will limit family and guests for each child's baptism to twenty (20) including parents, godparents and the child.

The Archdiocese has given us permission to schedule confirmations for our eight-grade students. With all of the confirmations postponed due to the shut-down, the Archdiocese has delegated pastors to confirm his parishioners. It is our goal to have these young people, who have already prepared for this day, to be confirmed before they begin high school. Due to the guidelines in place for the number of people who can gather in the basilica, we plan on having multiple services for the 120 candidates and families of our parish. Details are being communicated to the families.

Earlier this past week, Fr. Walter informed the Archdiocese and then us, that he will be leaving QAS on Thursday, June 18, 2020. Over the next few days he will visit with friends and family in North Carolina. We all remember his famous lines 'God is good, all the time. All the time, God is good'. We will miss him, and we wish him well.

# SIGNING UP FOR MASS

## QUEEN OF ALL SAINTS

1

### PARISH WEBSITE

Go onto the parish website and click on “Mass Reservation.” Then click on signup labeled “here.” Signups for the weekend and following week are available every Wednesday.

### PASSWORD

To sign up for a weekend Mass you will need to use a password. This password will be emailed every Wednesday before the weekend Masses. There is no password required for weekday Masses.

3

### CHOOSING A MASS TIME

Look through the Mass times and check “sign up” under the Mass time you want to attend then select “submit and sign up” at the bottom of the page.

4

### MAKING A RESERVATION

Put your name, email, and phone number in the designated slots. Then elect “sign up now.”

If you have 1-4 people in your reservation, make one reservation. If you have 5-8 people in your reservation, make two reservations. Do not include people living outside of your household in your reservation.

### CONGRATULATIONS

You have officially signed up to attend Mass. You will receive a reminder email two days before the date of your reservation.

### NEW TAX DEDUCTION

There is a new tax deduction for charitable contributions even if you take the standard deduction. The CARES Act (Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act) provides a new tax deduction for those who do not itemize. Starting in 2020, charitable donations can be deducted from taxable income up to \$300 per person, or \$600 for joint filers. Please consider this as you plan your 2020 charitable gifts to Queen of All Saints.

# SCHOOL NEWS



The end of the school year is always bittersweet, but this one more than most. Our students, faculty and staff left the building on Friday, March 13 with directives to take home their books, iPads and other items needed to work from home. Fortunately, our teachers had been preparing for remote learning since the fall and began lessons in all subject areas starting Monday, March 16. When preparations began for eLearning they centered around the possibility of staying at home for multiple days due to snow or cold weather. No one could have expected the coronavirus pandemic or the possibility of eLearning extending through the end of the school year.

Our teachers rose to the occasion! They tried new things, shared best practices and engaged students in new ways. The Google classroom platform that our 4-8 graders have been using for years provided a convenient way for teachers to communicate lesson plans and directions. Zoom, Google Meets and videos gave teachers the opportunity to present live instruction. Numerous online learning programs such as IXL, No Red Ink, Kahoot, Mathletics, and others provided students with practice lessons and assessment opportunities. Working together, our teachers and parents made sure students stayed on track for completing the curriculum.



On May 29 we celebrated our graduating 8th graders. While we couldn't have a traditional graduation ceremony, together with the parish staff we planned an unforgettable celebration for the class of 2020. Of our 67 graduating students, 56 of them will continue their education at Catholic schools. 11 students were offered spots at CPS selective enrollment high schools.

As we look ahead, we are carefully monitoring the progress Illinois and Chicago make in containing the number of COVID-19 cases. We are planning various scenarios for opening the campus in the fall while prioritizing the health and safety of our students, faculty and staff. Cardinal Cupich recently assured parents that the Archdiocese has every expectation of opening schools for in-person instruction in the fall.



During times like these, we rely on our faith to see us through. As a Catholic school, our mission is to provide an exceptional education and a solid foundation for our students to learn and grow in faith.

As always, the school appreciates the prayers and support of our parishioners.

## RELIGIOUS EDUCATION NEWS

A Special THANK YOU to all the Religious Education families, catechists and volunteers. This year would not have ended so smoothly had it not been for the dedication of all those involved in the program. In March, when the schools closed, and the stay at home order went into place, Religious Education classes had to switch to a remote platform. In addition to being their homeschool teacher, parents now acted as their child's catechist. Each week parents were provided a teaching guide and additional videos and activities to help walk their child through their remaining lesson and chapters.



Our amazing catechists continued to stay connected to their students as well. Some sent weekly emails, others made personalized video messages and lessons for their classes, others even sent them cards in the mail! It was great to see how much our volunteer catechists cared about their students and their families!

As we thought about how much more screen-time our children were getting during this time, we used Holy Week to encourage families to do crafts, activities, and even create snacks and food based around each day of Holy Week. Families had the opportunity to walk through Holy Week at home, away from the computer screen, spending time together while learning more about our faith.

We were also impressed by the dedication of our confirmation students. The 7th and 8th grade Religious Education students were given weekly lessons, instructing them what parts of their text to read, providing additional information on each subject through articles and short videos. After each lesson they completed an assessment of the lesson. Most of our students took these lessons

very seriously, as was reflected in their answers. We are proud to see so many young people motivated and committed to their faith. We look forward to celebrating your confirmation with you all soon!

Registration is open for the fall. We are putting into place more clear guidelines for how eLearning will be implemented, if needed, but we are hopeful that we can all return to the classrooms. Please make sure to register and pay by June 30 to receive an early bird discount.

## TEXT TO GIVE

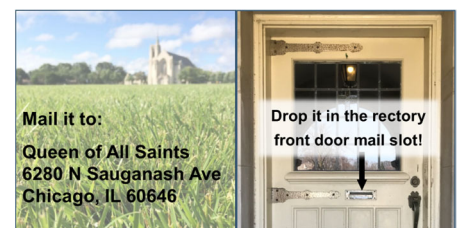
- If you currently have an active GiveCentral account, you may use the cell phone registered to your account to give by text.

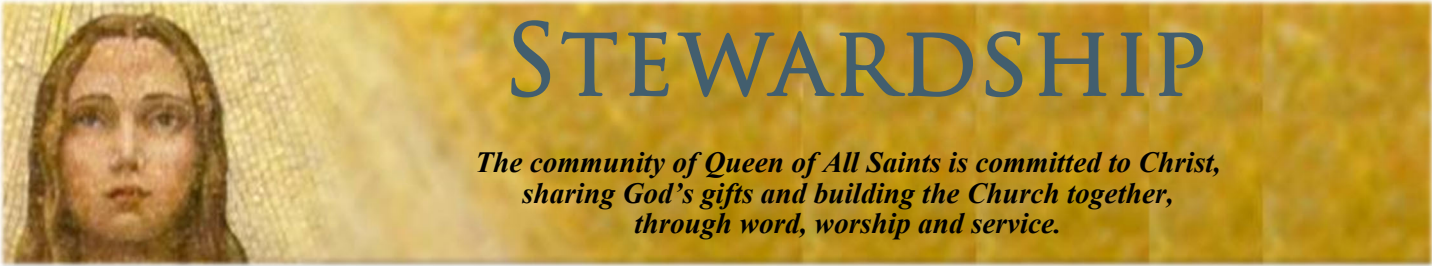

## **TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION**

In the tradition of the Church, not necessarily in your own life's timeline, confirmation is the midpoint of Christian initiation, standing between font and table. Full initiation is completed when a confirmed person shares in the Eucharist. Centuries ago, this first sharing in the eucharistic assembly was marked by a first sharing in the Prayer of the Faithful. This prayer raises up the needs of the church and human community, the concerns of the faithful assembled, as they prepare to lift up the world to the Father's love. So a person could not participate in the prayer until they were anointed with the "Oil of Thanksgiving." Next, the newly baptized presented their gifts at the altar, a sure sign of their investment a new way of life. Until the sixth century, these people normally drank a mixture of milk and honey as a kind of pre-Communion. They were hungry, of course, since they were baptized hungry after long fasting, but this beautiful symbol of the promised land revealed them as God's chosen, heirs to the promise. Although the "milk shake" disappeared centuries ago, we still see the vigor of this new life whenever adults are initiated at Easter, and increasingly in confirmation ceremonies that are attentive to this meaning.

## The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated at 1:30pm two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A baptismal preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

## The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

## Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.
