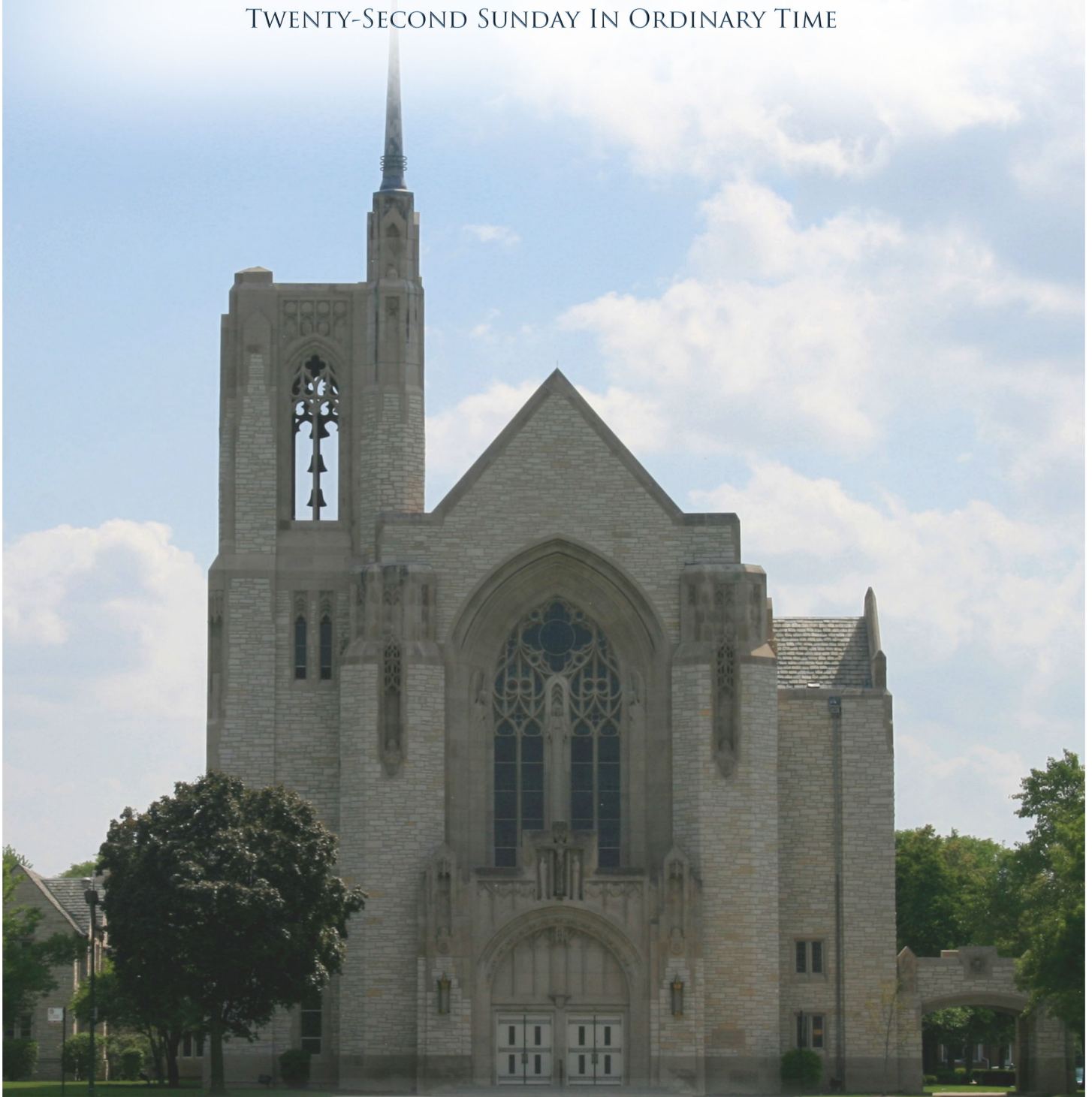

On Thursday, August 20th, in the shadow of the basilica under a tent, albeit a much smaller one than in previous years, we gathered for a ‘virtual’ celebration of our United Parish Program. The UPP leadership team along with a few parishioners, all with masks on and champagne in hand, had a ‘little fun’ streaming live on Facebook the much-awaited raffle draw and the winner of the wine-pull. Congratulations to all the winners!!

As we look back, I want to again highlight the theme of this year’s UPP, ‘Grateful, Mindful, Hopeful.’ I am grateful to everyone for your commitment, participation and support of our one and only parish-wide fundraiser. Your generosity is overwhelming. Last weekend, I sent out a note to help us reach our goal of selling 3500 raffle tickets and you responded. This allowed us to add another raffle prize of \$2500.

I am grateful to Laura Herbert and Laurie Vlastic, their spouses Dan and Ron as well as their children for their hard work and sacrifices during this most challenging year. From the very beginning, they focused on the ‘big revenue’ generators of the UPP –the raffle and sponsorships. They made some changes to the raffle to allow for greater participation and added incentives that paid off. Faced with the uncertainty of the pandemic, they kept finding ways to reach our goal of \$275,000.

I also want to extend my gratitude to Juan Cabrales, Barbara Graham, Cariane Keane and Louise Locke for the support they provided to Laura and Laurie and their commitment to chair next year’s event. Thank you!!

We have all been affected, some more than others, by the stay-at-home order and the closure of businesses. I am mindful of the unplanned plight of some in our parish who have either been laid-off or are working reduced hours. The funds raised from the UPP, which support the numerous ministries in our parish, will help us cope with the many unforeseen expenses that come with being even partially open and operational during this health crisis. The additional cleaning of our facilities, the need to invest in technology to be able to ‘virtually’ continue our baptismal preparation, RCIA and religious education program are all made possible through these funds.

Finally, I am hopeful for two things. One, we are a few thousand dollars short of our goal of \$275,000. Although our deadline to accept sponsorships ended this week, you can still be part of this united parish effort by just donating the cost of your dinner ticket to the event. This will surely help us reach our goal! Two, I am hopeful that next year we will be able to gather once again as a community, in the shadow of the magnificent basilica, under a sprawling tent and celebrate who we are – a people committed to Christ, sharing God’s gifts and building a community of love and fellowship.

Registration for Religious Education 2020-2021 is open!

The QASRE program begins at kindergarten and goes through eighth grade. Our program focuses on building a relationship with Christ as your children grow in their discipleship.

Students wanting to participate in the sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation must attend a minimum of two years of Religious Education as per the archdiocesan requirement. First Reconciliation and Communion preparation begins at 1st grade. Confirmation preparation begins at 7th grade.

A MESSAGE FROM QAS SOCIAL JUSTICE MINISTRY

Our Catholic faith strongly encourages us to vote and actively participate politically. But knowing how to participate can be challenging given our incredibly polarized national discourse. The US Bishops, while not offering an easy answer or voting recommendations, have provided two thoughtful articles.



The first is a summary of the US Bishops' Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship. Here are a few key quotes from the first article:

- The Church cannot and must not remain on the sidelines in the fight for justice. - Pope Francis
- In the Catholic tradition, responsible citizenship is a virtue, and participation in political life is a moral obligation.
- Rightly understood, this ethic does not treat all issues as morally equivalent; nor does it reduce Catholic teaching to one or two issues.
- Catholic voters should use Catholic teaching to examine candidates' positions on issues and should consider candidates' integrity, philosophy and performance. It is important for all citizens "to see beyond party politics, to analyze campaign rhetoric critically, and to choose their political leaders according to principle, not party affiliation or mere self-interest."
- Conclusion: In light of Catholic teaching, the bishops vigorously repeat their call for a renewed politics that focuses on moral principles, the promotion of human life and dignity, and the pursuit of the common good. Political participation in this spirit reflects not only the social teaching of our Church but the best traditions of our nation.

STEWARDSHIP IN TIME OF COVID-19

UNDERSTANDING OUR PARISH FINANCES

This difficult time has put a strain on our parish life, in our liturgical celebrations, in our social gatherings and in our parish finances. It is helpful to remind ourselves how we support our parish and the special challenges we face today.

Sundays, Holidays, UPP - This is our regular revenue and is by far the largest source of funds to pay for our parish operations. In a sense, this is what “keeps the lights on” by paying for our staff, our routine repairs and maintenance, and the other day to day costs of running the parish. **However, these are not normal times. Our maintenance costs have risen with the need to maintain a hygienic space for our Masses while our collections have decreased with the closure and partial reopening of the basilica this year.**

Long-Term Savings - We are blessed with savings resulting from the generosity of the past, including parish and school endowments. In recent years we were forced to draw upon our savings deeply to pay for unanticipated basilica repair costs, including the ceiling project, the bell tower project, and other repairs, and now we must take steps to replenish those savings. **In coming years we will need a significant increase in our Sunday collections to pay ourselves back and restore our savings back to a prudent level.**

Capital Campaign - Our capital campaign drive is aimed at making our older parish buildings (the Benedict Center and the Lemont and Keene Avenue buildings) more suitable for today's and tomorrow's needs. **Our final construction projections require us to raise our pledge target from \$5,000,000 to \$6,000,000, and we have already raised \$200,000 in pledges toward that new target. Please consider how you can help us reach our new goal.**

We believe that a well-informed parish membership deserves a candid explanation of parish finances. Please be as generous as you can in supporting our parish and the many ways it touches and helps all of us at all times of our lives.

The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated on Saturdays. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A baptismal preparation class for the parents is required. Please contact the rectory for further details. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.
