A MESSAGE FROM QAS SOCIAL JUSTICE MINISTRY

The US Bishops' [Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship](#) in last week's bulletin stated that participation in political life is a moral obligation, and encouraged Catholic voters to use Catholic teaching to examine candidates' integrity, performance and positions on issues. Take-away quote: "Political participation in this spirit reflects not only the social teaching of our Church but the best traditions of our nation."



But, how do you reconcile candidates' positions with the directive to not treat all issues as morally equivalent AND to not reduce Catholic teaching to one or two issues? Here are a few key "how to" tips from the US Bishop's second article, [Making Moral Choices and Applying Our Principles](#):

- As Catholics seek to advance the common good, we must carefully discern which public policies are morally sound.
- Opposition to intrinsically evil acts also prompts us to recognize our positive duty to contribute to the common good and act in solidarity with those in need. Both opposing evil and doing good are essential.
- The basic right to life implies and is linked to other human rights such as a right to the goods that every person needs to live and thrive—including food, shelter, health care, education, and meaningful work.
- The bishops do not tell Catholics how to vote; the responsibility to make political choices rests with each person and his or her properly formed conscience, aided by prudence.
- The bishops wrap up with their list of public policies that should concern Catholics most. View their "top 9" list by clicking here:

Given the polarization in our national discourse, it is easy to predict that half the country will wake up disappointed on November 4th. However, it is more difficult to predict if we will treat each other respectfully despite our differences in opinion. Recall the words of the song... "they'll know we are Christians by our love". FALL STEWARDSHIP A TIME TO RECONSIDER OUR COMMITMENTS

Proportionate - make a firm decision to give a certain percentage of our time and our income to our parish and to other charities.

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated on Saturdays. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A baptismal preparation class for the parents is required. Please contact the rectory for further details. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.

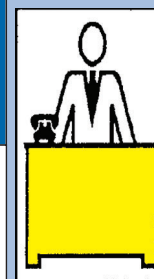
