

FROM FATHER SIMON



Last Wednesday, September 30, as I was planning to write my column for the bulletin, Fr. Grace informed me that he tested positive for COVID-19. Immediately, I abandoned plans of writing. All the priests went out to get tested and the staff were asked to leave the office ASAP and get tested. We suspended all Masses in the basilica and informed the archdiocesan authorities.

In the next couple of days, the results kept coming in. Almost all of the priests and the entire staff tested negative. Msgr. Pollard tested positive.

After discussions and following the protocols of the Archdiocese and the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) we have been advised to reopen the basilica for public Masses on October 12, 2020, barring any new information.

Fr. Grace and Msgr. Pollard are in isolation and have had mild to moderate symptoms. They are following their doctor's advice and are in consultation with the archdiocesan nurse practitioner. The outpouring of prayers, well-wishes and support has been overwhelming and I want to thank you all for your generosity and patience as we ride this through.

Please note that neither Fr. Grace nor Msgr. Pollard have been in contact with the students or staff of our school or entered the school facilities since long before any expected COVID incubation period. The school will remain in operation pursuant to our current COVID restrictions and guidelines.

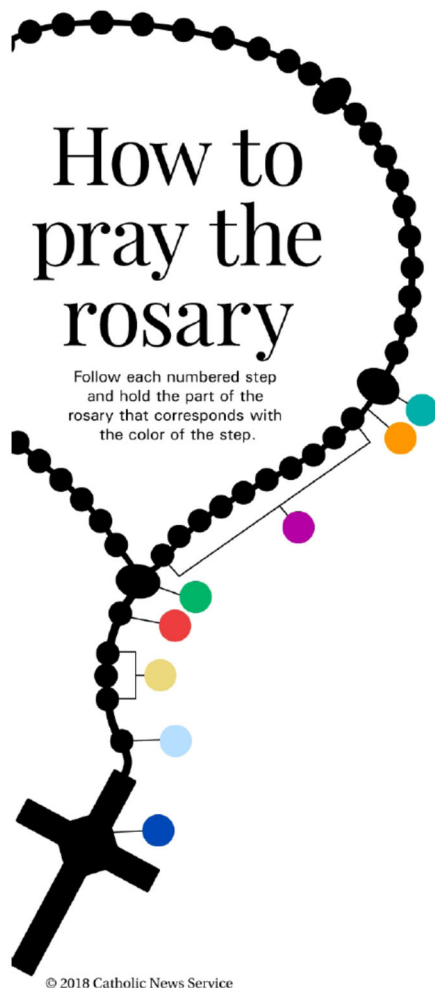
We are aware that this virus cannot be taken lightly and we have notified all of those who attended any of the Masses celebrated by Fr. Grace or Msgr. Pollard since September 23, 2020 (thanks to contact tracing) to watch for symptoms for 14 days.

In the meantime, I want to assure you that per our COVID parish cleaning and disinfecting protocols, our worship space and all common areas continue to be thoroughly disinfected regularly following each and every liturgical event. Everyone's health and well-being remain our foremost priority. All of us priests, since we reside in the same household, will be tested again and return to public celebrations of the sacraments only after our quarantine period ends and we are free of any symptoms for three days or more. Please continue to pray for us and for one another.

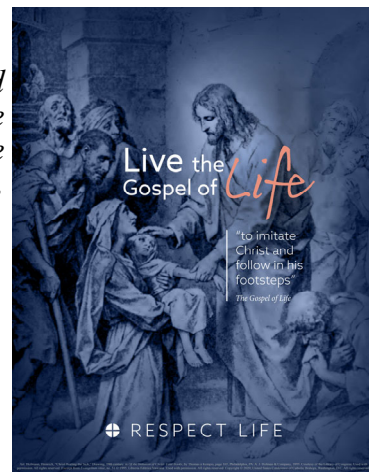

RESERVATIONS FOR MASS

Our Mass attendance is increasing each week, especially the 9am Mass. We encourage everyone to make a reservation so that you are guaranteed a seat. Those without reservations may have to wait to be seated or may be turned away if we are at capacity. Please note, reserved pews will be held only until 5 minutes after Mass begins. After that time those who are waiting will be seated.

CONFESSIONS

We celebrate the sacrament of reconciliation on Saturday mornings following the 8am Mass. If you are not attending the Mass, the priest usually begins at 8:30am and will continue until all are heard. Enter through the southwest Keene Avenue doors. Don't forget your mask!

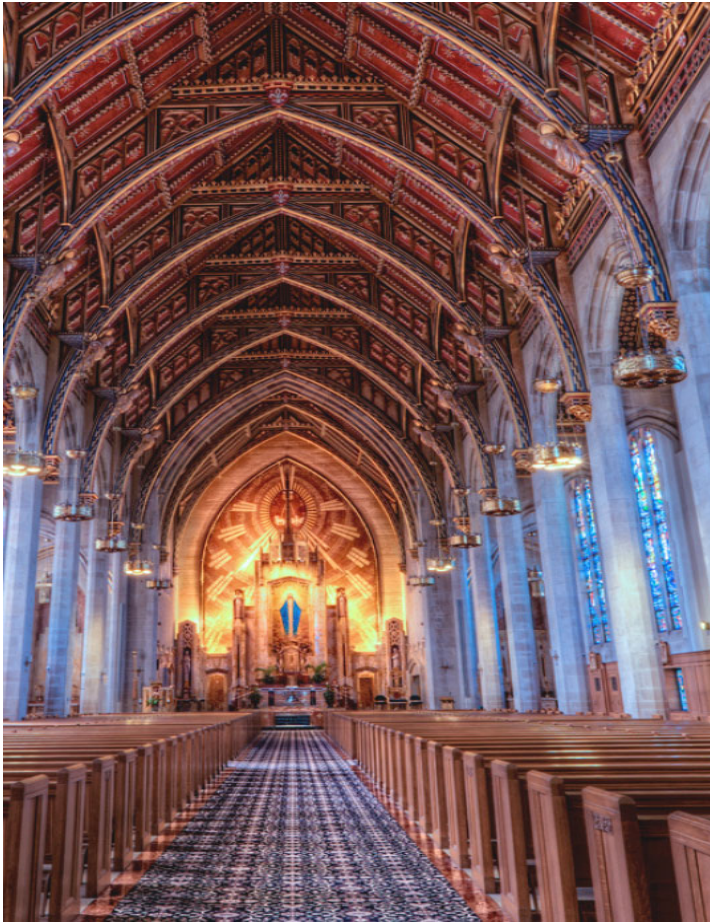

How You Can Help A Victim

ACKNOWLEDGE the severity and difficulty of the situation.

BE SUPPORTIVE. LISTEN. Keep an open mind.

REAFFIRM that he/she should not stay in an abusive relationship.

HELP develop a safety plan.

BE NON-JUDGMENTAL.

ENCOURAGE him/her to spend time with family and friends outside of the relationship.

PROVIDE phone numbers and website addresses for help services and local shelters.

SUGGEST opening a checking or savings account if possible.

REMEMBER THAT YOU CANNOT "RESCUE" A VICTIM; HE/SHE HAS TO MAKE OWN CHOICES.
Whether or not the victim ends the relationship, continue to be supportive.

A 4TH QUARTER THOUGHT DIRECT CONTRIBUTIONS FROM YOUR IRA

If you are 70½ or older and have an IRA, you may qualify for a charitable giving opportunity directly from your IRA.

- You are now allowed to make direct transfers from an IRA to Queen of All Saints Parish.
- This is an ideal situation even for those who do not itemize deductions since the withdrawal is not considered taxable income.
- Our parish will receive 100% of your transfer.
- You can transfer up to \$100,000 annually.
- Although the required minimum distribution rule has been temporarily suspended for 2020, remember that for future years this type of transfer can be credited against your RMD.

The tax-free nature of this withdrawal may have a number of other favorable benefits affecting your tax return, depending on your particular situation, such as reduced taxes on Social Security distributions or future Medicare premiums.

New tax deduction for charitable contributions - even if you take the standard deduction.

The new **CARES Act** (*Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act*) provides a new tax deduction **even for those who do not itemize.**

Starting in 2020, charitable donations can be deducted from your taxable income up to \$300 per person, or \$600 for joint filers.

Please consider this as you plan your 2020 charitable gifts to Queen of All Saints.

GOD REVEALED TO THE NATIONS

What wonderful images we have today of the reign of God! Isaiah speaks to us of a great feast - a heavenly feast - a feast of abundance with rich foods and choice wines. It is the Lord's own affair, Isaiah explains, when God will unite all nations, dry every tear, and destroy death forever. Then, too, will the entire earth rejoice in the Lord and bask in God's saving grace.

Jesus speaks of heaven in terms of a feast as well. Here, the kingdom of heaven is likened to a king's wedding feast given for his son. This is a feast of abundance also, with the fattened cattle prepared just so. But many of the people invited don't want to come, so the king invites anyone who would honor his son by their presence there. And Paul tells us that whether we live abundantly or in humble circumstances, we can do all things in the Lord who strengthens us.

The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the sacrament of baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The sacrament of baptism for infants is celebrated on Saturdays. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A baptismal preparation class for the parents is required. Please contact the rectory for further details. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the anointing of the sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.

Today's readings do nothing less than reveal the secret to happiness. To whet our appetite, Isaiah describes what paradise feels like: "a feast of rich food and choice wines, juicy, rich foods, and pure, choice wines." In this paradise, says Isaiah, God dries our tears and puts an end to death. The psalm response lures us with its own descriptive words for paradise: restful, refreshing, fearless, overflowing. Just when all of these extravagant images seem too good to be true, Saint Paul's letter brings us down to earth. Paul is confident that he will one day be in heaven, but he knows just as certainly that he is not there yet. His "secret" to happiness is to trust in God's providence under every earthly circumstance. Echoing Isaiah's images of paradise, the Gospel promises that the Lord has invited us all to the heavenly feast. Like Paul, may we respond with trusting hearts.
