## FROM FATHER SIMON



‘A December to remember’ is a catch phrase in a commercial for a brand of cars. However, I feel that November is a month ‘to remember’.

November is a special month for remembering who we are as a people and who we are as a church. On November 1st we gather to celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints – a day which honors the more obscure saints as well as the saints each of us have known. On November 2nd, we observe All Souls’ Day. On this day, we will have a special liturgy for families who have had loved ones buried from our parish this past year. During the shutdown, some of these families did not have the opportunity to honor their loved ones with a funeral Mass. We hope that a remembrance of their loved ones at this special Mass will help comfort them in their grief. The church has always encouraged prayer for the dead. We believe that it is an act of Christian charity to pray for a loved one as a way of erasing any distance between us, even the chasm which death imposes. For when we pray, we place ourselves in God’s presence in the company of those we love even if those persons have gone before us in death.

On the second Monday in November we celebrate Veterans’ Day. We remember and give thanks to and for those who defend our freedom by praying for the veterans whose lives are scarred by the wounds of battle and those who are haunted by the experiences of combat and may need our help even more than our praise and thanks.

We bring the month of November to a close with our celebration of Thanksgiving Day. We gather as a family, as a church and as a nation. It may not be as in years past due to the pandemic. All the same, we remember and give thanks to a good and gracious God for all of the blessings that are ours. The Liturgy of Thanksgiving Day gives voice to the spirit of this time, a spirit we are called to make our own. *“God our Father, from your hand we have received generous gifts so that we might learn to share your blessings in gratitude. Accept the gifts we bring and let the perfect sacrifice of Jesus Christ draw us closer to all our brothers and sisters in the human family so that we may share with them all the gifts of time and eternity.”*

From the perspective of a pastor and steward, don’t forget to remember Queen of All Saints parish as you prepare to make your required minimum distribution from your IRA this year.

As we enter into this special month of November, we have special liturgies that will help us celebrate and remember that each of us is a unique person, fashioned by a loving Creator, who are but part of a larger communion of persons stretching back (and forth) in time. Please plan to be part of our special celebrations throughout the month of November, here at Queen of All Saints.

November 2 is the Feast of All Souls, the commemoration of all the faithful departed. Here at Queen of All Saints we especially remember our loved ones who have passed in the last year at a special memorial on the day of All Souls.

This year due to restrictions many families were unable to fully celebrate the life of their departed loved one. The All Souls Memorial Liturgy is a way to remember your loved one with the Queen of All Saints community. As we begin the service, the name of the departed will be read aloud and a candle lit in their memory. Their names are also inscribed in The Book of the Dead which is enthroned at the Sacred Heart altar throughout the month of November.

Those who have been buried from Queen of All Saints since last October (2019) are already included in The Book of the Dead and will be named at the memorial liturgy.

### *THE BOOK OF THE DEAD*

Each November, as we approach the end of the liturgical year, we reflect on the end of time, the Second Coming of our Savior and our salvation. In this context, we especially remember our loved ones who have gone before us. We inscribe the names of those we want to remember in The Book of the Dead. The Book of the Dead is carried in procession at the memorial liturgy on All Souls Day and enthroned on the altar of the Sacred Heart throughout the month of November.

## What does it mean to form my conscience?

Catholics have a long tradition of engagement in the public square. Sometimes that engagement requires making difficult moral decisions that impact our own lives and those of others. Our conscience can help guide the decisions we make. The Second Vatican Council guides us: “Always summoning [one] to love good and avoid evil, the voice of conscience can when necessary speak to [one’s] heart more specifically: do this, shun that” (*Gaudium et Spes* 16). However, our conscience doesn’t just come to us when we are born. We must work throughout our lives to form it through prayer, learning, and conversation.

### How do I form my conscience?

It takes time to form our consciences so that we can make well-reasoned judgments about particular, real-life situations. The Church teaches that it is important to work continually on conscience formation so we can be prepared to make decisions whenever the opportunity arises. Some specific ideas to form your conscience are:

- 1) Begin by **being open to the truth** and what is right.
- 2) **Study Sacred Scripture** and the **teaching** of the Church.
- 3) **Examine the facts** and **background information** about various choices and be discerning in where we gather information.
- 4) **Prayerfully reflect** to discern the will of God (*Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*, no. 18).

Additionally, it is important to consider how

our community of faith can help us form good consciences through some of these steps:

- 1) Seek the **prudent advice** and **good example** of trusted leaders and others to support and enlighten our conscience.
- 2) Learn about the **authoritative teaching** of the Church.
- 3) Pray for the **gifts of the Holy Spirit** to help us develop our conscience.
- 4) Regularly partake in an **examination of conscience** to hear God’s voice in your life.<sup>1</sup>

Doing the work of forming our consciences can seem daunting. Fortunately, we have many church teachings that can help us in this important task. *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship* is an important resource for U.S. Catholics and helps us prayerfully reflect on how we can apply Church teaching in our civic life. “Conscience is not something that allows us to justify doing whatever we want, nor is it a mere “feeling” about what we should or should not do. Rather, **conscience is the voice of God resounding in the human heart**, revealing the truth to us and calling us to do what is good while shunning what is evil.”<sup>2</sup>

Here are some questions for further reflection:

1. When has my conscience guided me to “do good and avoid evil”?
2. What are some key resources I can use to form my conscience?
3. Forming conscience is a “lifelong task.” What do I do to **regularly** form my conscience? What more should I do?

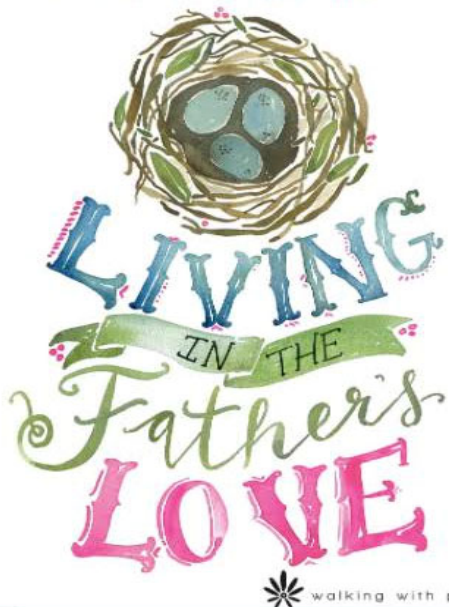

## WHAT IS HAPPENING IN RCIA

Two weeks ago, four inquirers joined us to begin the process of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA). These are adults who have not been baptized, were baptized in another denomination, or were baptized Catholic and have not completed the sacraments of initiation (baptism, Eucharist, and confirmation). RCIA isn’t a simple program or a set of “Catholic lessons,” it is a journey to know God and his people. This journey began with God calling each of them in individual ways, and I am thankful God has given me and the RCIA team the privilege to walk with them at this time.

Right now our inquirers are in the “period of inquiry.” The period of inquiry formally begins when the inquirers reach out to be part of RCIA and it continues until November 22<sup>nd</sup> when our inquirers participate in the Rite of Acceptance. During this period our inquirers will virtually meet each week to discuss the ways God has called them, engage in prayer, read scripture, talk about Jesus Christ, the uniqueness of the Catholic faith, and begin to walk through the beauty of the Mass.

I ask you to pray for our inquirers. Pray that they continue to open their hearts to Jesus. Pray for their family members and friends to be supportive. Pray that they feel the warmth and love of Christ in our parish community (even during these social distancing times). Lastly, I ask you pray for the RCIA team and myself as we embark in a new way of participating in ministry - virtually!

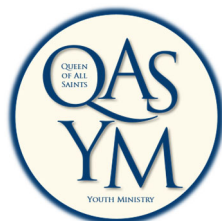

## Myths and Facts about Domestic Violence

**Myth:** *Most of the time, domestic violence is not really that serious.*

**Fact:** Domestic violence is an illegal act in the U.S. and is considered a crime with serious repercussions. Although there are aspects of domestic violence (e.g., emotional, psychological, spiritual abuse) that may not be considered criminal in a legal sense, serious and long-lasting physical, emotional and spiritual harms can, and often do, occur. Each and every act of domestic violence needs to be taken seriously.

**Myth:** *Anger management programs are briefer, more cost effective than, and just as successful as certified batterer intervention programs.*

**Fact:** Although briefer and less expensive than certified batterer intervention programs, anger management programs are not effective to address the deep-rooted issues of batterers.

**Myth:** *Domestic violence is an impulse control or anger management problem.*

**Fact:** Abusers act deliberately and with forethought. Abusers choose whom to abuse. For example, an abuser will selectively batter his wife but not his boss.

**Myth:** *Victims provoke their partners' violence.*

**Fact:** Whatever problems exist in a relationship, the use of violence is never justifiable or acceptable. There is NO EXCUSE for domestic violence.

**Myth:** *Domestic violence is bad, but it happens elsewhere. It doesn't happen in my community, my neighborhood, my culture, my religion or my congregation.*

**Fact:** Domestic violence happens to people of every educational and socio-economic level. Domestic violence happens in all races, religions and age groups. Domestic violence occurs in both heterosexual and same-sex relationships.

**Myth:** *It is easy for a victim to leave her abuser, so if she doesn't leave, it means she likes the abuse or is exaggerating how bad it is.*

**Fact:** Fear, lack of safe options, and inability to survive economically prevent many women from leaving abusive relationships. Threats of harm, including death to the victim and/or children, keep many battered women trapped in abusive situations. The most dangerous time for a battered woman is when she attempts to leave the relationship, or when the abuser discovers that she has made plans to leave.

**Myth:** *Children generally are neither aware of, nor affected by, their mothers' abuse.*

**Fact:** Nearly 90% of children who live in homes in which there is domestic violence will see or hear the abuse. Children as young as toddlers can suffer from the effects of exposure to abuse. Children exposed to violence and other forms of trauma may have permanent alterations in brain structure, chemistry, and function.

**Myth:** *Since domestic violence is a problem in the relationship, marriage or couple-focused pastoral counseling is key to restoring tranquility in the family or relationship.*

**Fact:** This type of counseling often increases the risk of violence to the victim. Faith and religious community representatives can promote safety and restore personal integrity and self-esteem to the victim, and can suggest batterer intervention services for the abuser, but should not engage in couples counseling unless the long-term safety of the survivor, and of staff, can be assured.

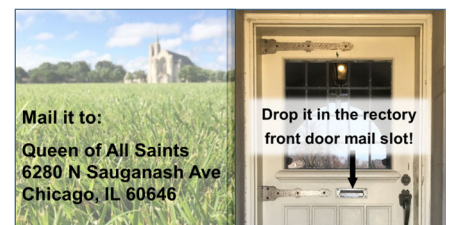
- If you currently have an active GiveCentral account, you may use the cell phone registered to your account to give by text.
  - The phone number to give by text is 773-661-4683.
  - To make a Sunday donation send a text with the keyword “*sundayqas*” followed by an amount (e.g., to **make a \$100 donation to Sunday collections, text: *sundayqas 100***). To make an Easter donation text “easter” followed by the amount. Leave a space between the keyword and the amount.
  - If you do not have a GiveCentral account, you may still text the same way to the same number which will then return a link that will allow you to enter your contact and payment information for your donation.
- At this time, donations may only be made to Sunday and Easter using Text to Give.

If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The sacrament of baptism for infants is celebrated on Saturdays. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A baptismal preparation class for the parents is required. Please contact the rectory for further details. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

## The Sacrament of Matrimony

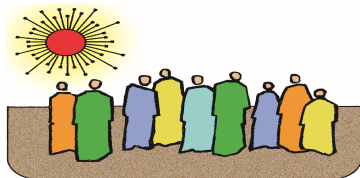
